

School transfers posted

The Halton Board of Education announced more teacher shifts for the coming year as well as naming a couple of new department heads at Thursday's meeting.

Georgetown District High School teacher Verna Linney will become head of the school's history department this fall, while Acton High School teacher Bill Taylor becomes associate head of social sciences for that school.

Only two teachers on the list are leaving Halton Hills schools for positions in other areas. Don Otto leaves Centennial Middle School for Falgarwood in Oakville and David Lawrence leaves Stewarttown Senior School for E.C. Drury school in Milton.

Two new faces on Centennial's staff will be Glenn Austin from Milton District High School and Cam Crosby from George Kennedy Public School.

Greg Sora will go to Stewarttown from General Wolfe and Bonnie McDougall will go to Acton District High School from Lester B. Pearson.

New faces at Joseph Gibbons in Georgetown will belong to Carolyn Beavau, who was at Robert Little School in Acton and Tom Travis, who was at W.I. Dicks, Milton. Sandra Fox will leave Joseph Gibbons to work in Limehouse, while Beverly Johnson leaves for Robert Baldwin in Milton.

Two new faces at Pineview will be Lucinda Doucette from East Centre and Elizabeth McQuattie who is now at Park

in Georgetown and will be in both Park and Pineview next year.

Dorothy Vandermolen will go to Harrison in Georgetown from Lawrie Smith, while

Lenora Vickery will go to Robert Little in Acton from Brookville.

Board's five-year plan could cost \$23 m.

Implementing all the recommendations in the various reports presented to the Halton board of education with an eye to setting a long-term direction for Halton's educational system will cost taxpayers an additional \$22,064,952 by the end of 1985.

Changes and additions to existing board facilities over the next five years would cost the board \$3,149,900.

The addition of 54 teachers to teach French as a second language and special services support staff will cost the board \$5,444,390 to bring Halton's school program up to the

level suggested as necessary by 1985.

The addition of 40 special education teachers in elementary school and 60 in high school as well as 15 guidance instructors for students of the middle school age, coupled with the extra French teachers included under the program portion of the report (but not included for cost purposes here) will cost the board \$8,470,662 for its additional staff.

In terms of mills the cost will be 2.76 for 1981, 4.68 for 1982, 5.71 in 1983, 7.01 in 1984 and 8.13 in 1985.

As Milton trustee Bill Law-

son put it, "This is where we find out the crunch - what it's all going to cost. It's all very well to theorize and idealize, but we wind up having to decide on what we can afford."

The board will be looking at the various reports presented to it during the past few weeks later this month. They will then accept, reject or revise suggestions in the various reports, and finally work out the long-range directions in which the board wants to move over the coming five years.

Babies booming

The baby boom seems to be alive and well in Halton Region, according to 1978 statistics released this week. Almost one out of every 100 births recorded in Canada in 1978 occurred in Halton, with 3,199 live births here being registered. The majority of the births were to women between the ages of 20 and 29; there were 23 births to women over 40 years old. There 349,000 live births recorded across Canada in 1978, the latest year for which complete statistics are available.

Forestry management

The Halton Region Conservation Authority will be continuing its forestry management program at ten regional sites this year using an \$85,635 grant from the provincial ministry of natural resources, it was announced last week. Total estimated cost of the program is \$155,700.

Steam at hospital?

The consulting firm of Kilborn Ltd. will be engaged by the region to approach the Georgetown District Memorial Hospital on the possibility of installing a modular incinerator for the production of steam. The incinerator would be located on land adjacent to the hospital. Coun. Russ Miller told The Herald that the steam generated would more than meet the hospital's needs.
