Approximately one in four of Metro's doctors are now out of the Ontario Health Insurance Plan - an increase of 255 doctors to 1,039 in total, in two years. Statistics tabled in the Legislature by the Ministry of Health show the biggest defection was by Metro specialists. The province-wide picture is not quite so bad - a total of 2,071 doctors, or 16.9 per cent. Anesthetists had the highest percentage of dropouts, with nearly 63 per cent, or 321.

ONTARIO'S LEGAL SYSTEM A recent survey by Ontario's Corrections Ministry found that two-thirds to threequarters of all cases admitted to jail waiting for bail or trial were eventually released without a jall sentence. The Ontario Government is also launching employment programs to try to find jobs for 10,000 able-bodied but unemployed people on probation from prison who now cost taxpayers nearly \$2 million a month in welfare. More than 30,000 people are now serving probationary terms and 'about half of them are

ONTARIO HYDRO

Ontario Hydro will pay about 40 per cent more than current world prices for initial deliveries of uranium this year and a 40-year contract signed in 1978 with Denison Mines Ltd. Signing of the \$7 billion contracts with Denison and Preston was authorized by the Premier on February 28, 1978, over strong objections from the opposition parties.

The Legislature's select committee on Ontario Hydro Affairs has voted unanimously to resubmit its budget for 1980-81 without changes, although the Board of Internal Economy wanted it to "consider further that section of the proposed budget dealing with legal, consulting and witness fees" and come back with an alternative budget.




