# Lady Green-thum'n

In spring blossom the fantasies (cultivated by gardening books) of having the biggest fruits and vegetables and displaying the best flowers.

It should be noted for all times the extent of my outdoor gardening is picking a hot spring day, throwing all my seeds into my green apron and skipping around the house like "Janie Applesseed". That's it, folks: from then on it's Mother Nature all the way.

So if you're in the process of germinating your own seeds and have a few neat tricks up your green sleeves, please share them with us.

When dealing with local gardening centres, valuable growing time is saved if a problem arises. If results are good when dealing from afar, by all means stay with what works for you.

Beside buying the usual, try one or two new seeds/bulbs that have been developed. Don't be afraid to experiment, you may grow a real winner. Do not buy specials if they won't be used, it's neither sound economics

or planning.

Try different centres and market gardens because they carry different products, seeds and plants.

Old seeds that have been kept dry, dark and airtight will usually produce. Have fun; experiment; you have nothing to lose in non-germination, but everything to gain if they do.

Cultivate a flower garden for fresh cuts and your own floral arrangements.

Perennial means the plant will grow from year to year; and most increase in number after the initial planting. Best planting time is early fall while the ground is still warm, allowing new roots to develop for a good display next year.

A true annual completes its life cycle from seed sowing to setting and dies in a 12-month period. Better to germinate indoors early part of year for transplanting flower outdoors summer or fall.

**FRESH CUTS**

Biennials are plants that take two years from seedling to production of maturity. They grow during the first year, flower, fruit and die the next year.

Snow in open or cold frame from middle of May to end of July. Early sowings produce storable plants well-established before winter.

Gardens should be planned ahead of time, considering the usage of seeds from above categories. Instructions and information are usually on the back of seed packets.

For those who want to begin from seed, use seedling

flats of shallow containers with good drainage. Garden soil (loam) should be mixed with Perlite for aeration. Place containers in or near windows for light. If you are using your own outdoor soil, wet it down, place in roasting pan, bake for 30 minutes at 180 F (82C) to kill any diseases, insects or weeds that may be in soil. A balanced soil will contain clay, silt, sand and will retain nutrients and moisture.

**SPRING INTO FALL.**

When planning your garden, you want flowers blooming from spring into fall. In border gardens large plants at back, medium in centre and short at front. There are no set rules for shapes of borders, use what you have and a little imagination. Space plants for air circulation and additional plants.

South gardens: choose sun-loving plants, north prefers partial shade plants.

Don't plant between buildings or trees, these areas funnel winds and unless staking is done, plants will be destroyed.

No holds bar for color combinations or varieties to be used. Here's a good place to express yourself.

Winter protection should be light covering to permit free access of air. When ground freezes, water expands heaving plants upward. Continual thawing and freezing worsens the situation. With protection, roots are saved from being torn and exposed. Cover when ground is frozen and remove when new growth is seen in spring.
