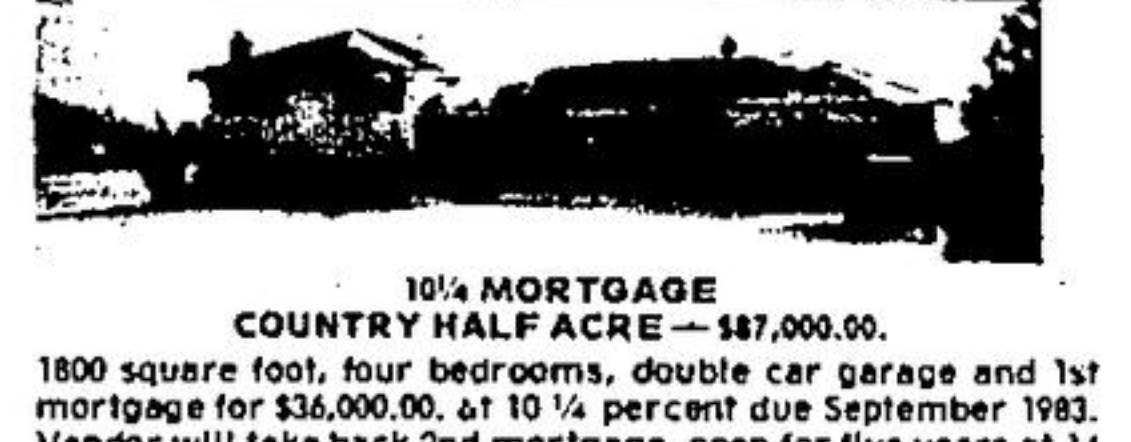

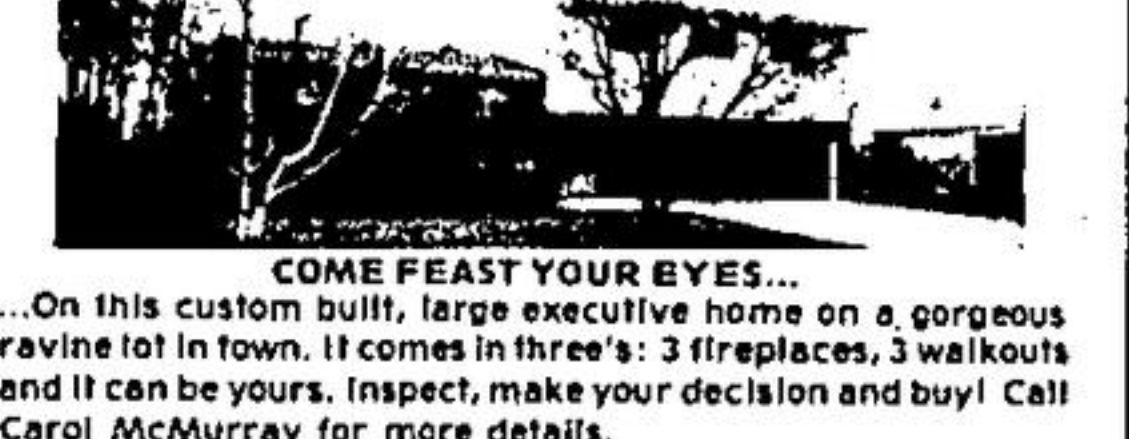

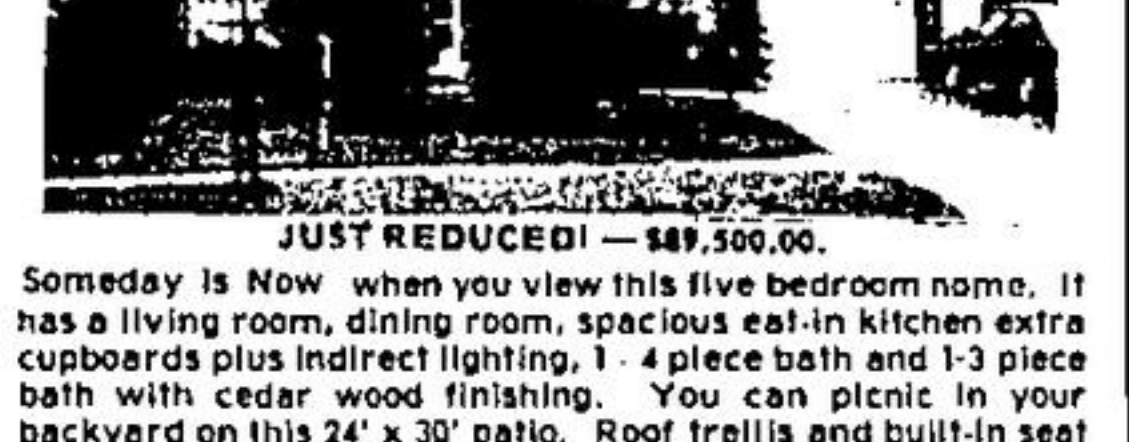

Barging excursions in Europe

Whether your idea of the perfect holiday is to get away from it all in a remote hideaway far from the usual route or to get to it all in dazzling capitals, Europe can bring that idea to fruition via its inland waterways.

A barge cruise through the Burgundy countryside provides the perfect complement to a whirl through Paris, while London makes the ideal jumping-off spot for exploring the Avon or the Thames Valley.

American Express' "Champagne Barge Cruise" gives you six nights aboard *La Guepe Buissoniers*, a comfortable hotel barge with 14 outside cabins, spacious dining room, salon and sun deck. All meals are included and feature regional specialties made from the freshest ingredients, plus unlimited table wine.

The cruise begins with a pre-dark sail through Paris and continues along the Marne and Seine or, at times, the River Aisne.

While the itinerary varies as sections of rivers close during low water periods, chances are you will visit Meaux, famous for its mustard and Brie, the old castle town of Chateau Thierry, and Epervan, capital of Champagne.

Seven English-speaking crew members see to your needs, and a motorcoach and driver await your pleasure for

side trips to Rheims and Hautevillers, home of Dom Perignon.

"Floating Through Europe" offers seven-day cruises in France aboard the 14 passenger *Linquenda*.

Their "French River Cruise" sails from Fontainebleau (a Renaissance palace set amid 40,000 acres of forest and formal gardens) through Sens (charming shops and restaurants line the river's bank), Villeneuve (built by Louis VII as a fortified royal residence), Joigny (a picturesque market town) and Auxerre (from which you can explore the vineyards of nearby Chablis and sample the zesty wines that call the area home).

The *Linquenda* measures 112 feet in length and whips along at four miles per hour.

The 14 guests (six double rooms, two singles) can count on the crew of five to have every situation well in hand. Bicycles and a chauffeured minibus are provided for shore excursions.

While England has a network of navigable rivers that stretches for 2,000 miles, it takes only the 60 mile stretch along the River Avon from Stratford to Tewkesbury to make a water gypsy out of the most confirmed landlubber.

The *Beverly* and *Jean* (a pair

of gaily-colored barges that serve respectively as salon and guest quarters) will be your home for seven days.

Welford-upon-Avon (a thatch-and-timber village that still boasts a traditional Maypole), Evesham (where you can follow the path taken by Lady Godiva in 1265), Broadway (the picture-book example of a Cotswold village) and Tewkesbury (whose Abbey Church of St. Mary's rates as one of England's finest Norman structures) number among your ports-of-call.

Trevor and Anne Townley are your hosts (the steers, she cooks), and they and their crew know every turn of the twisting Avon.

Attractive rooms (private bath and air conditioning) spell comfort, and wayside pubs afford a wide choice of spots for night (or afternoon) caps.

You soon slow down to the pace of the barge, and every now and then you just might notice strollers overtaking you.

If you number among that majority of travelers who consider London the capital of the world, you might be surprised to discover that it also is a jumping-off place for an escape to an other-worldly retreat.

Port of embarkation: nearby Windsor. Your escape hatch: American Express' "Thames River Barge Cruise" aboard the *Clement* or *Cadence*.

Your trip begins with a tour of Windsor—the town and Royal Castle. Then your route up the Thames takes you to Marlow (every artist's favorite village), Henley (home of the world's most famous regatta), Dorchester Abbey (where you can explore a Stone Age fortress) and to Oxford (of course!).

The cruise can be taken in the opposite direction if you prefer floating downstream. At shore stops, a mini-bus takes you to stately homes, historic villages, country markets and centuries-old churches.

Meals (including full English breakfast and hearty, home-made lunches and dinners with wine) number among the all-inclusives.

A maximum of 12 passengers keeps things intimate, and a non- hectic schedule guarantees no-rush days and tranquil nights.

Although you may think you know the Thames, you've never known it as you will when you drift leisurely along on your barge.
