"We need all the help you can send," the officer, Haji Taj Mohammad Khan told a delegate from the Red Cross

"In this area temperatures fall to zero on the mountains at night, and the refugees are on the mountains. Some of them brought only two or three blankets. We have only been able to supply seven or eight thousand blankets and 1,800 tents for these 80,000 refugees". He added that although

86,000 refugees were registered, there could be "about 20,000 unregistered refugees" living somewhere in the mountains receiving no help whatsoever.

The internal situation in El Salvador is worsening rapidly. During the most recent events in the capital, more than 500 people were killed and 300 wounded. Daily, there are
