Arbitration ends contract talks stalemate

Halton Regional Police have gone to arbitration for the first time in six years in an attempt to resolve their contract dis-

The negotiating committees from the police commission and the Halton Regional Police Association met with arbitrator Gell Brent Friday in Burlington to present their proposals. The arbitrator has 60 days in which to file a report, but association executive member Staff Sgt. John Van der Lelie sald a decision is expected within three or four weeks.

Negotiations between the association and the commission have been stalemated since March. The association is seeking a pay increase of 15 per cent for 1980. This would increase the salary of a firstclass constable to \$24,971 from \$21,714. The commission is offering a raise of 7.5 per cent, which would give a first-class constable a salary of \$23,342.

The association is also seeking two-man patrol cars between 4 p.m. and 8 a.m., but the commission says this is not necessary in Halton.


