Explore Glen area art studios

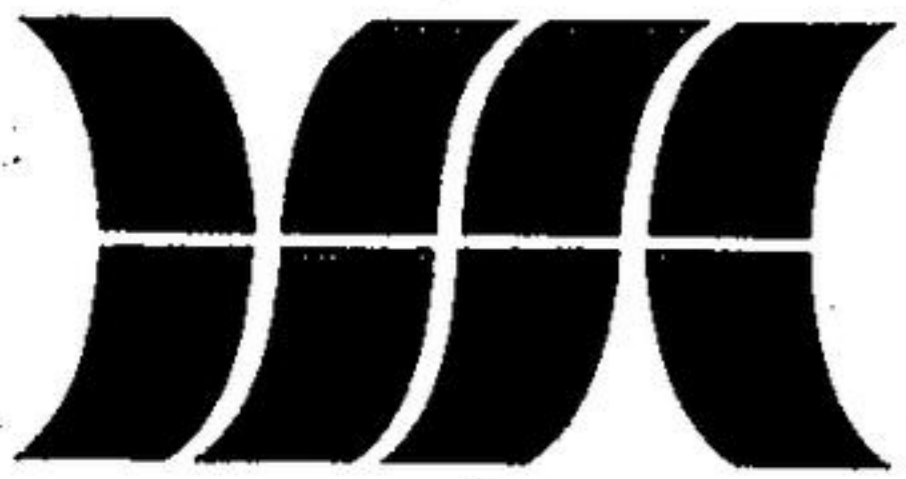

TERRA COTTA's big weekend is coming JULY 5 AND 6! Plan to visit this arts community and join in the fun! The clown face-painting by Josie Arnold is expected to give the village a real festive air, as dozens of clowns start roaming about the locale.

JOSIE ARNOLD, an art student at the Ontario College of Art, created a series of clown sketches which won her a scholarship for six months study in Florence, Italy, beginning in September. THE GALLERY CONNECTION, a name given to the Arts in Terra Cotta which links many arts concepts together, such as Vivian Hunter's TIBETAN ART AND RUG COLLECTION, THE CRAFT BARN, THE FORGE GALLERY and Pat Bell's COUNTRY GALLERY.

Some featured artists as you meander in this creative community will be MELANJA BRAY, showing real flowers arranged in glass, MARY BUCHANAN, soft-sculptured dolls, clothespin and reversible cloth dolls by DOREEN SIGMUND as well as many handcrafted items by PAT BELL.

Moving along THE FORGE STUDIO GALLERY, which will celebrate the opening of its summer collection, we find work by 15 young professional artists. Blown glass by PETER ZIF, and CHERYL WILSON, french dyed silk scarves by CAROL SIEBERT and CATHY REID, weaving by ALISON WALTERSON, watercolors and prints by JO WALTERSON, one of the artists in residence at THE FORGE, and pottery by PEGGY MCKENZIE, CLAUDIA BELAK and AGNES OLIVE, the latter also an artist in residence at THE FORGE.

At No. 1 Isabella Street in Terra Cotta, you will be able to view Vivian Hunter's Tibetan Paintings and Carpets by refugees in Northern India.

Mrs. Hunter does not retain any commission and all monies received is remitted to the two communities which produce the Art. This art revenue aids in the education and maintenance of Tibetan elderly. The areas assisted by the Art sold are in the foothills of the Himalayas in northern India.

Mrs. Hunter spent some time in this district visiting artists and her foster son and his family. Knowledge of the craft was demonstrated by showing how they made handmade paper from several barks including mulberry bark and how they prepare the natural earth colors from rocks and semi precious stones.

Weather permitting, Mrs. Hunter will have a KITE FLYING CONTEST each afternoon July 5 and 6 at 4 p.m. Kite flying is the favorite entertainment of the Tibetans of all ages. Mrs. Hunter is also planning a TOUR of the TIBETAN refugee settlements in Northern India for 15 people in the autumn of 1981. Anyone interested may direct their inquiries to Vivian Hunter 877-2431.
