

Ontario Outdoors

QUESTION: What color plastic worm should I use when fishing for bass? Joe M. Georgetown, A. In Ontario I have found that a six to nine inch worm with an "action tail" such as Mister Twister is best. Use black at night and as the sun comes up go to purple and as the sun gets brighter go to blue, then green and reverse this system as the sun goes down. Use other colors as the mood suits you and the bass refuse other colors.

QUESTION: What is the best way to "strike" a bass? Mike C. Acton, A. Most fishermen don't strike hard enough. The mouth of a bass is tough, and the old adage "cross his eyes" is a good one. Try this on plastic worms and live baits; when you detect a hit or "tap" on the line, reach forward with the arms extended, reel MOST of the slack line and with a fluid motion, "sweep" the rod at arms length over your head. This will drive the hook into the bony jaw for sure hooking. The reason for slack line, is you can hit harder if you don't have your flat on the other man's jaw, but hit him from a distance.

The 10 pound-plus Rainbow trout in KELSO near Milton has not been caught yet. The \$50 prize to the angler catching this trout is worth going for. Kelso was stocked with 4,300 trout at the start of the season, and the many other activities make it a good family spot. MOUNTSBERG, West of Campbellville south of the Hwy. 401 is another great family place with wildlife and hiking trails. Always lots of guided tours and films.

As promised, a run down on the system called FLIP-PIN. This is a system of jig fishing for bass with a slider rig. It allows you to fish inside tree and weed tangles. When you locate a good looking piece of structure, slow down and fish it with a round head jig, rigged weedless as shown in last week's ONTARIO OUTDOORS.

Actually, any kind of jig will work, and tip the jig with a plastic worm or other type of hook dressing. A rod length of seven and a half feet is best, pull out as much line as the length of the rod, pull pot line in left hand and flip under hand. The jig will come toward you, when line is tight, flip rod up and let line out of hand and "slide" the lure just over the surface of the water. Let jig drop gently into water at target.

You need heavy line for this type of fishing, even as high as twenty-pound test, the fish hit so fast they will not be deterred by the line. With a little practise you will be able to drop a lure lightly right on target, even when that target is only two inches in diameter. As you can see, you must be very close to the target area, but the fish are under brush and will not see you. Just don't make noise in the boat, and if anyone needs further clarification, I will try to oblige with a demonstration.

DEER SEASONS for 1980 in ONTARIO were released June 24th by JAMES AULD, Minister of Natural Resources. The season in this immediate area is for residents only from October 20 to December 13.

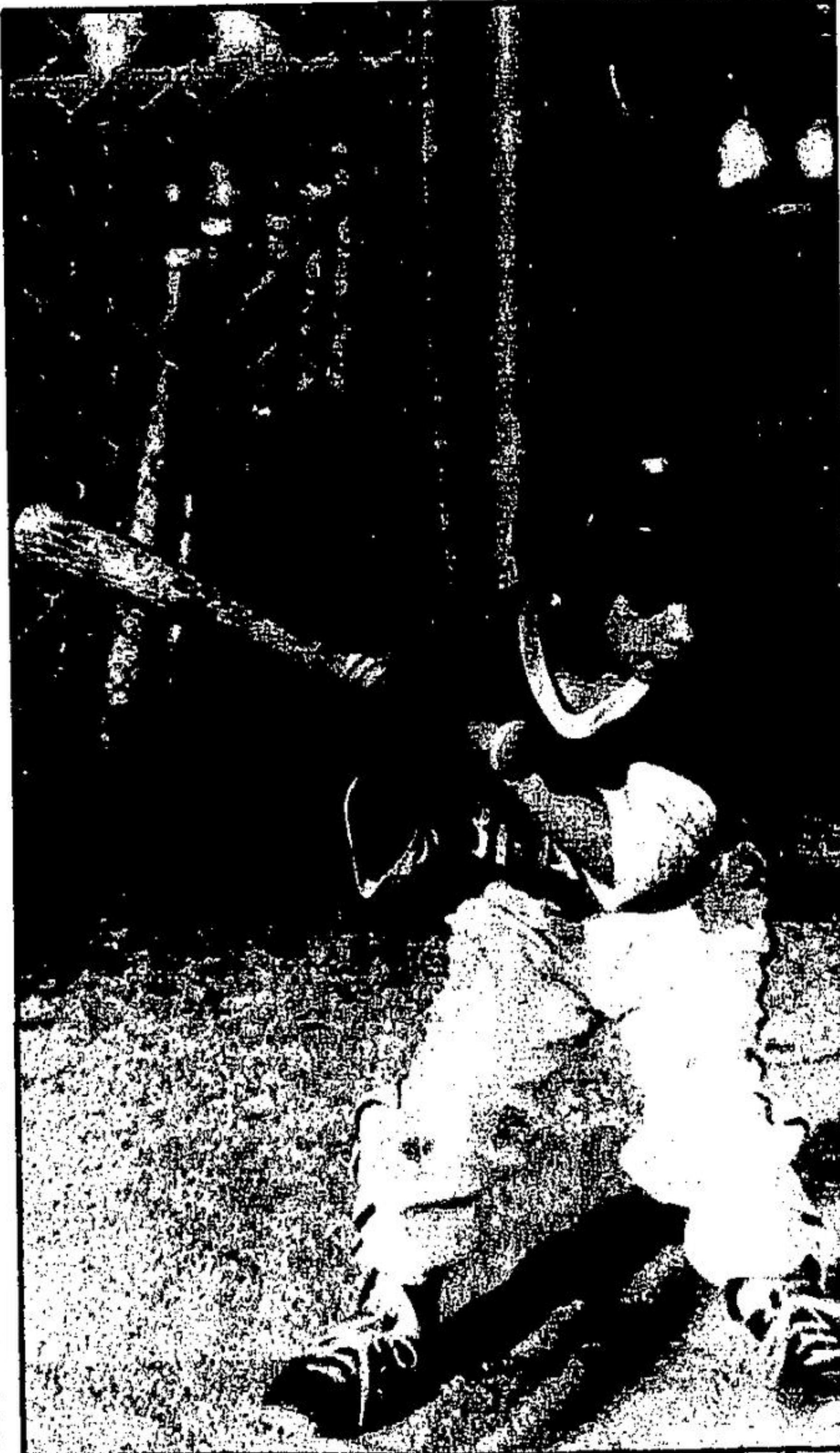

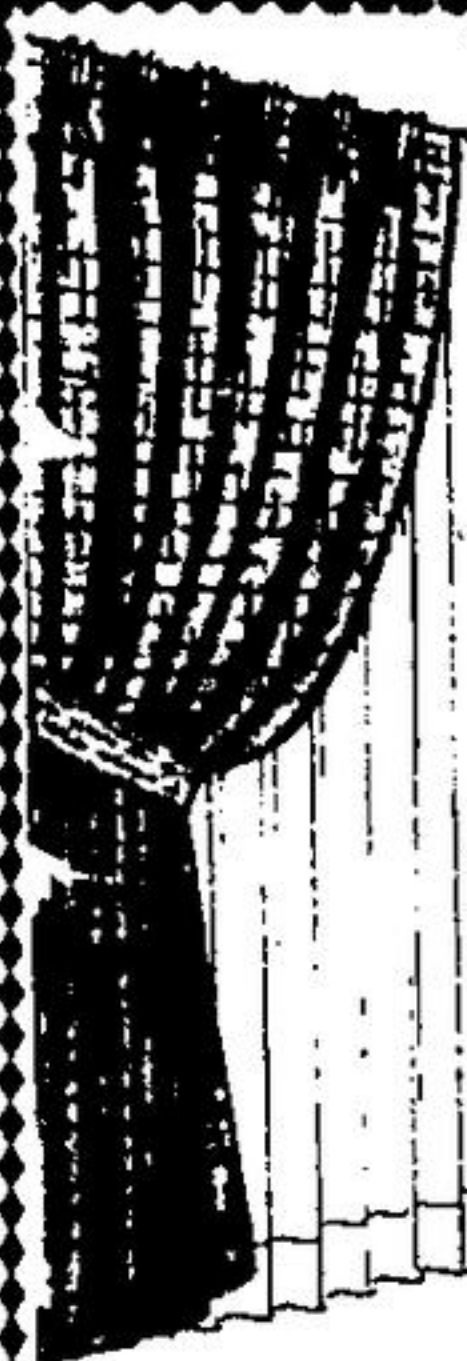

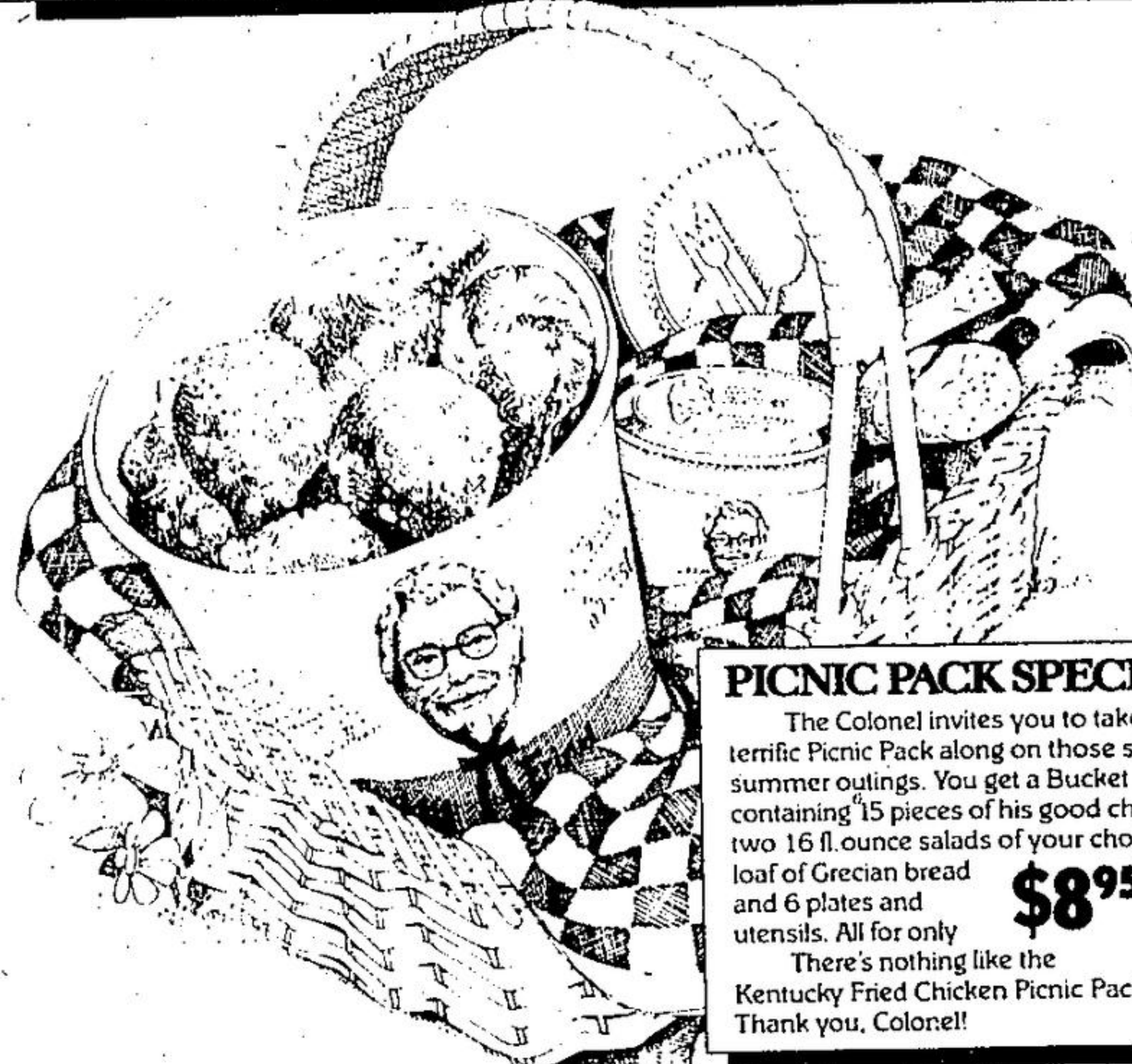
