### Gas wells ordered plugged or pumped by government

The provincial government has ordered Halton region farmers to either plug up old gas wells on their properties, most of which were drilled 50 years ago, or else put them back into production.

All but one of the 12 to 15 involved have decided they would rather plug than pump. In the 1920s Tony Seynuck, a Ukrainian immigrant, explor-

ed this area looking for oil and gas. Some of his finds were put into production but others were just left because they were not worthwhile.

Now, despite much higher gas prices, owners are confirming the earlier decisions and permanently putting the wells out of commission.

Bob Heyward, of the petroleum resources branch of Ontario's ministry of natural resources, said there could be

valuable pockets of natural gas but the government is insisting that the old wells either be improved or plugged.

Mr. Heyward sald a number of the wells were in production for 20 years or more but due to low pressure they are no longer commercially viable.

The government asked the farmers if they wanted to use the gas themselves but only one took up the offer.
