New pool bylaw meaning precise

The new consolidated bylaw outlining fence requirements for privately owned swimming pools returned to the town's general committee agenda Monday night, about three weeks after it was delayed for a better definition of "swimming pool".

Earlier this month, town council expressed concern that ponds located on agricultural land might be defined as swimming pools and therefore owners would be required to abide by the fencing bylaw. There was also some discussion about whether or not a hedge could be considered a safe and protective fence.

Under the amended bylaw. "pool" means any "privatelyowned body of water located outdoors...which is contained in part or in whole by artificial means in which the depth of water at any point can exceed .6096 metres (24 inches)", the use of which is limited to swimming, diving and wading by the property owner and his

The bylaw exempts ponds "located on lands zoned agirucultural or rural".

Fencing, according to the bylaw, must be of "vertically boarded, wood construction, chain link construction or of other materials" which provide "an equivalent degree of safety."

Council will vote on the bylaw July 7.

Eastern Avenue

sewers

The town's general committee decided Monday to add a storm sewer along Eastern Avenue to tenders being let for sewer construction in Acton's Lakeview subdivision.

The 450-foot long sewer is needed to redirect waters from the road and Holly Industries into an existing storm sewer on Church Street, instead of onto Beardmore Tunnery lands, where they may create problems with the tannery's sanitary sewer system during a summer shutdown. Town engineer Bob Austin

suggested that the Eastern Avenue section be simply added to a contract the town is already seeking and this would save some money. Estimated cost of the project is \$15,000.
