Hall Road condo proceeds as town rejects \$155,000 site

Herald Staff Writer O and P Construction Company has decided to go ahead with its plans to build a condominium on its Hall Road land in Georgetown following Monday night's council decision not to purchase the property for use as a park at

the asking price of \$155,000. ' The decision ended negotiations between the town and the company, which was represented by vice-president Al Pilutti, aimed at reaching an equitable agreement for the town's acquisition of the eight acres located behind Fagan Drive, Roydon Place, Rosefield Drive, Wilson Court and Hall Road.

Coun. Roy Booth, whose successful motion stated that council is "unwilling" to buy the land for \$155,000, said the purchase would be "a little too rich for our blood".

"I was trying to be as generous as I could," Mr. Pilutti told council, "when I decided to sell the land to the town at \$155,000".

Mr. Pilutti said he purchased the property for \$135,000

lot, at \$230,000. He said his company had already spent \$6,000 in engineering fees and another \$5,000 in legal fees to have the property registered and estimated that he is losing another \$3,000 on the property


