



LANDMARK COMES TUMBLING DOWN

Hall Road condo proceeds as town rejects \$155,000 site

O and P Construction Company has decided to go ahead with its plans to build a condominium on its Hall Road land in Georgetown following Monday night's council decision not to purchase the property for use as a park at the asking price of \$155,000.

The decision ended negotiations between the town and the company, which was represented by vice-president Al Pilutti, aimed at reaching an equitable agreement for the town's acquisition of the eight acres located behind Fagan Drive, Roydon Place, Rosefield Drive, Wilson Court and Hall Road.

Coun. Roy Booth, whose successful motion stated that council is "unwilling" to buy the land for \$155,000, said the

purchase would be "a little too rich for our blood".
"I was trying to be as generous as I could," Mr. Pilutti told council, "when I decided to sell the land to the town at \$155,000".
Mr. Pilutti said he purchased the property for \$135,000

and estimated the market value of the land, at \$10,000 per lot, at \$230,000. He said his company had already spent \$6,000 in engineering fees and another \$5,000 in legal fees to have the property registered and estimated that he is losing another \$3,000 on the property

to bank interest rates.
Coun. Harry Levy proposed that the town purchase the Hall Road lands at \$10,000 per acre and give O and P Construction the one-acre lot located beside Alcott Arena.

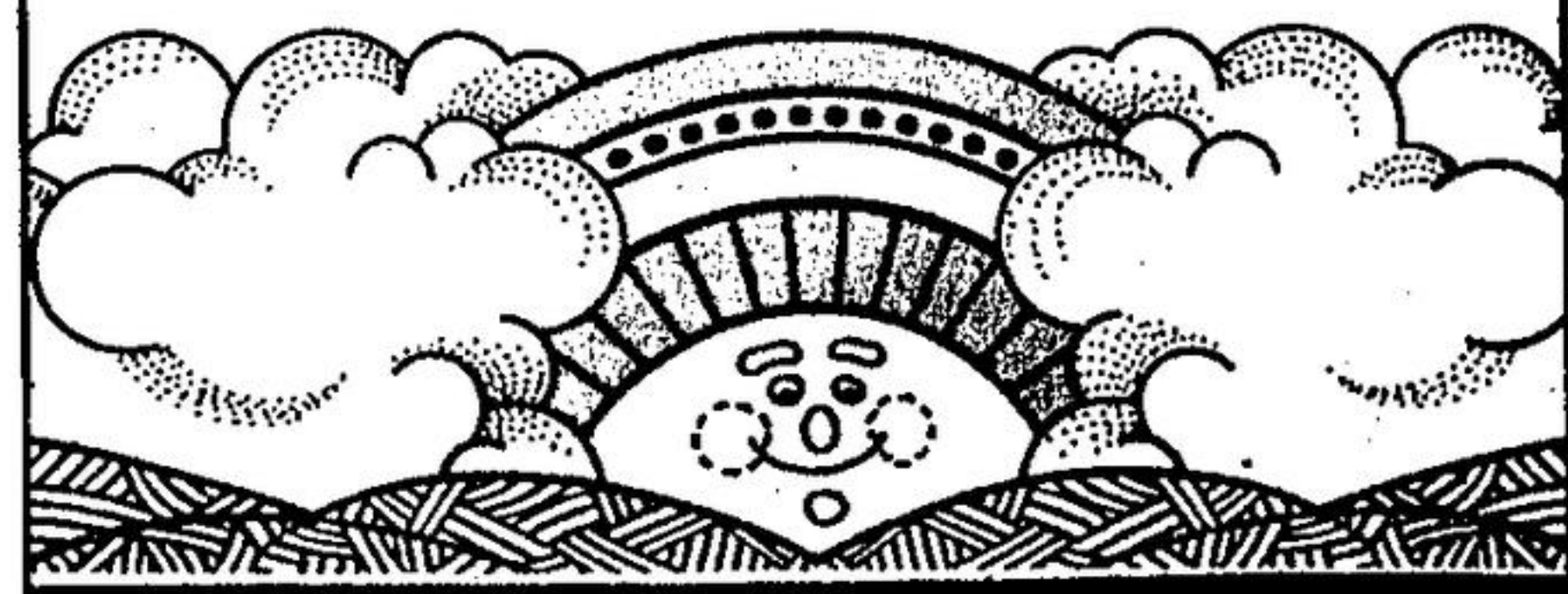
