The development of Marywood Meadows near the hospital made some changes in trade activity downtown and, more recently, the opening of the Silver Creek Towers apartments has lent an optimistic outlook for more business in the downtown core.

The Toronto-Dominion has offered customers for the last two years no-charge chequing accounts on balances not less than \$200, which has now been raised to \$300 minimum balance. In addition to this service, T-D has a daily interest personal chequing account which gives the customer greater banking scope. The "Green Machine" card provides customers with all banking services.
