There is a degree of responsibility attached to the care and control of players whilst under the command of coaches and managers before, during and after game and practise time. The degree is limited to the time whilst the coach is present. Upon arrival the coach takes command; upon departure, or end of time, if parent or guardian is on hand, command ceases.

Coaches are to find out if the unaccompanied players have arrangements for getting away from the field. It is not the responsibility of the coach to "baby-sit". It is even more for parents and guardian to make transporting and caring arrangements and remains their ultimate responsibility.

RESCHEDULING
House league matches cancelled within club rules will normally be rescheduled; firstly if schedules and fieldtime permit; secondly if necessary to decide top and bottom positions in leagues; and thirdly to give the kids their due soccer periods. As far as possible rescheduling will be carried out.

House league matches abandoned may be recast dependent on the same reasons plus taking into account the time when the game was abandoned and why.

Normally if a game is stopped before the half it will be replayed; if after the half the game will not be replayed and the score at that point will become the final result. The major criterion is the reason for stopping the game. Weather and discipline would bring differing judgements, for example.

Recently we had an altercation between two adults. One was a stand-in coach and the other a parent on the touch line. The matter was dealt with at executive level.

One of our younger competitive teams recently faced a much stronger opponent away from home and had to do so with only eight players. Naturally they crashed to a heavy defeat. The boys who played did themselves and their team justice. Those who stayed

away did not and are the cause of the loss. Playing "Rep" means what it is, representatives of Georgetown and failure to meet the commitments of playing reflects badly against player, team, club and town.

The club should seriously consider not allowing such players to represent us at the competitive level.

To continue my tirade against O.S.A. - What benefit is derived from membership? Other than taking part in officially recognized soccer in league, cup and tournament play - for which privilege we pay additional dollars - very little benefit indeed. At club level we may continue to have our own internal organization, constitution and bylaws. We may continue to provide recreational and competitive soccer without the sometimes long distances involved, travelling costs and time. Administrative and other costs would remain in our own locality. The financial burden would be eased at official, coach, player and parental levels.
