Set in a southwestern Ontario farmhouse, this play is full of suspense, surprises and character contrasts and will hold your interest. The production at the TARRAGON is heightened by artistic sound and lighting and excellent acting by the cast 'on the boards'.

"I'll Be Back Before Midnight" was first performed at Blyth Summer Festival in 1979 and since has been included in several company's seasons. My only criticism could be in the writing or in the artistic director's interpretation, but the suspense in the second act was "milked" a little. However, when I read the script shortly, this will determine the source of such a concept. In any case, this play is a winner and a credit to Canada.
