New business reflects home decorating trend

A new business has opened in Georgetown, "reflecting" an increased popularity in using mirrors for effective home decorating.

The Mirroline Designs Ltd. shop located in Main Street's Old Bank building, marks a successful milestone for owners Koos Kuljer and his wife, Angela, who put their creative talents to mirror design a scant three years ago.

"I used to work for the House of Viking in Toronto," Koos (pronounced Koss) told The Herald Monday, "and I could see the furniture business slowly going down, so I decided to get into mirrors."

Within a month, Koos, who admitted he didn't know how to cut glass before he started, created his first mirror design. Working out of their Huttonville home, Koos and Angela created more designs while Koos then tried to sell to coasters.

Although Koos managed to sell a few items to designers, he received his first break in Brampton after one store ordered six of his creations, all distinctively marked with his initials, JK (J for Jakobus, his Christian name). Since then, Mirroline De-

signs has grown, arousing enough interest among home designers that the company now employs salesmen in Montreal and Toronto. Koos displayed his work at the Ontario Design show in Toronto last fall and another display is

scheduled for the spring. 'high class' furniture," Koos says of the creations he and his wife have made. Mirroline designs come in numerous sizes and shapes, including mirrored room dividers, planters, coffee and end tables. decorative pryamids and a line of simple, but novel mirror

The designs often juxtapose mirrors against each other, or at angles for a variety of refracting effects and some of the designs are inlaid with broad bands of bronze or patterns of stained glass. Koos also makes simple and practical mirrors bordered with frames for bathrooms and bed-

"There's an unlimited amount you can do with mirrors," Koos said. Mirrors can brighten a dark room, make it seem larger and even cooler. While Koos admits that busi-

ness is growing pretty fast, he maintains that "good service "It's what you might call is the most important thing". Mirroline Designs will ship any of their pieces across the country, and in fact, are doing brisk business in Halifax.


Gideons.

There won't be any children's fashions because the Yeo's feel the prices on these items make them a "rip


The couple love antiques and have a few pieces in their store to add atmosphere. They consider their selling technique is also rather oldfashioned since they don't believe in high pressure sales
