The chair, along with a list of former Acton mayors and a picture of the late Les Duby,

Acton's last mayor, are decorating the window at Acton Family Cleaners as part of the committee's promotion of tick-

et sales. The \$100 tickets entitle purchasers to take part in the weekly Actario draw to begin in September. Weekly prizes of \$350 will be awarded as well as monthly trips valued at \$1,200 to \$1,800.

The committee hopes to raise \$60,000 through ticket sales which will enable them to pay their share of the \$236,000 restoration cost for the old

Mr. Tyler said that he is determined to see public washrooms included in the restored hall no matter what other facilities are included or excluded when the finished plans are made.


