OFFICIAL

The executive, commissioners and directors meeting of the youth group held the regular meeting at Cedarvale this Monday, 11th, at 8:30 p.m. The time is later than usual as I am officiating at 7:00 p.m.

We will need to arrange field time for crucial make-up games in the league. We will set up and prepare for the cup playoff tournaments.

The girls and Atom boys cup games are already allocated and distributed to coaches and managers. The make-up games in league play will be rescheduled if (1) the field time is available, (2) necessary to decide top and bottom places.

fired). Kary Jones and Arlene Gray were our lone front players against the odds.

As an indication of how well we played, the first goal came after 25 minutes, the second after 65 minutes. The remaining four came when the girls were tired out. We even had the only corner kick of the first half and managed to be caught outside twice. The girls have reached the semi-final of the Ontario Cup and with a full squad can be sure of an exciting contest against Waterloo or St. Andrew's for a spot in the final.

BLIZZARD BYELINE

The Blizzard entertained European Cup Champions Nottingham Forest, under F.I.F.A. rules, in a right royal exhibition game.

Forrest attacked from the first whistle putting Blizzard goalkeeper Blagie Tamindic under pressure although he came up with several saves. The visitors took an early lead through newcomer Ray Ponte who stole the ball from Sam Lenarduzzi and blasted for No. 1.

The absence of the 35 yard line (and F.I.F.A. rule) allowed play to flow and Forrest showed up against to the long crossfield pass. Peter Lorimer, midfield star of the match, placed 4; yard passes perfectly to the front runners.

From one such pass, to Rob Prentice and an elusive cross to Gordon Sweetzer came the equalizing goal. Gordon brought the ball down and fired hard and low inside a diving Peter Shilton's right hand, inside the post.

Peter, arguably the world No. 1 goalie, showed his class later with a diving save from a Peter Lorimer thunderbolt, both of which had the record 34187 crowd on its feet in applause.

Late in the second half Forrest scored two more goals for the win, in an excellent game of soccer.

Blizzard took the opportunity to play Scots-Canadian Gordie Wallace, who played very well from left midfield. The improving Randy Hagan, Mike McLennan and re-introduced Jim McAlister received good experience playing against world class opponents.

Other than Cliff Calvert's speedy runs from defence and Peter Lorimer's twisting and long-probing balls the Toronto side were slow to move into attack allowing Forrest time to regroup.

WEAKNESS EVIDENT

The same weakness is evident in N.A.S.C. games and needs worked upon. Blizzard have the talent to be much better than the 12-14 league record to date. Escape from an injury prone season cannot be helped. Colin Franks, Jono Sono, Drew Busby, Jose Velasquez, George Gibbs and Tony Churaky are current members on the injury list and that is one-third of the first team squad.

A passing thought. There were fans from the far corners of Ontario and over from New York state to view the game more matches against this class of opposition will bring the fans out in droves and improve the calibre of home bred talent with this experience.
