Honor for Terry Fox

Nominations flowing in

At least 500 Halton Hills residents have endorsed Dorothy Stone's campaign to award amputee runner Terry Fox the prestigious Order of Canada.

The Georgetown artist and heraldry expert told The Herald this week she has collected 379 signatures supporting her formal nomination of the 22-year old Marathon of Hope runner who visited Halton Hills last month. Another 30 nomination forms, most containing two or more signatures, have been filled in and clipped from The Herald's July 30 and August 6 issues for submission.

Miss Stone explained that she is still trying to obtain a few essential details about Terry Fox needed for the official nomination. Brampton-Georgelown MP John McDermid is assisting her research.

As well as the signatures collected personally by Miss Stone during visits to downtown Georgetown and other areas, petitions set up on her behalf at several locales have attracted much sup-

Most successful was the petition posted at the Country Cheese Shop on Georgetown's Mill Street, which

attracted 97 signatures. The Georgetown library's petition sheet added 74 more, the Royal Canadian Legion's branch 120 35 more and the Georgetown precinct of the Halton Regional Police another 18. A petition was also posted at the Georgetown Independent, among other

Among the signatures obtained at the Cheese Shop was that of Darrell Fox, Terry's younger brother, who apparently contributed his support during an "anonymous" visit to the store during Terry's stay here.

Once all signatures are collected and the proper nomination form completed, Miss Stone will contact the Director-Secretariat of Honor in Ottawa to make the formal nomination. A select committee chooses' deserving nominces each year to fill vacancies within the Order created by the death or resignation of former members, officers and companions. Membership is greatly restricted in number.

Halton MP Otto Jelinek tried unsuccessfully to have the House of Commons nominate Terry for the honor. His motion failed to receive the MP's unanimous consent, necessary for it to be discussed on the floor.
