Nursing home fire could occur here

Haiton nursing home operators say a disaster such as the fire which took the lives of 24 nursing home residents in Mississauga could easily happen here.

Centennial Manor administrator John Charlton agrees that a similar incident could occur here. Centennial Manor is a residence for 340 Halton senior citizens, located in

Milton.

Charlton says a complete evacuation plan should be worked out for Centennial Manor. The residence is made up of two buildings, a single-storey housing 190 and a three-storey building housing 150. A plan to install smoke detectors in every room is now before the Ontario Fire Marshal for final approval.

St. Joseph's out of jurisdiction, board won't alleviate fire hazards

The Halton Separate School board has no plans for major construction work on St. Joseph's School in Acton to remedy problems in the fire Inspection system discovered by Fire Prevention Officer Larry Brassard during a recent inspection tour.

Mr. Brassard the town's fire inspector, said the school's fire alarm system may have been improperly installed and the placement of smoke detectors in the basement may not be adequate.

The board's plant manager, John Birett, says the school is not under the separate school board's jurisdiction because it is leased from the Halton board of education. He is also upset with the wording of Mr. Brassard's report. If the system is not right, then Mr. Brassard should say so, and the board will correct it, Mr. Birett said.

It would not be practical for the separate school board to undertake any major repairs to bring the building into line with the Ontario Building Code because the cost would be too high, he said. -

A hydro inspector will visit the school to check on some of the matters mentioned by Mr. Brassard in his report. Mr. Birett said he has written to the Halton board of education. asking them to install two thermal detectors as Mr. Brassard recommended. He said the separate school board would be willing to pay the other board to install them.




