



A TIP OF THE HAT TO SOME FORMER STAFFERS

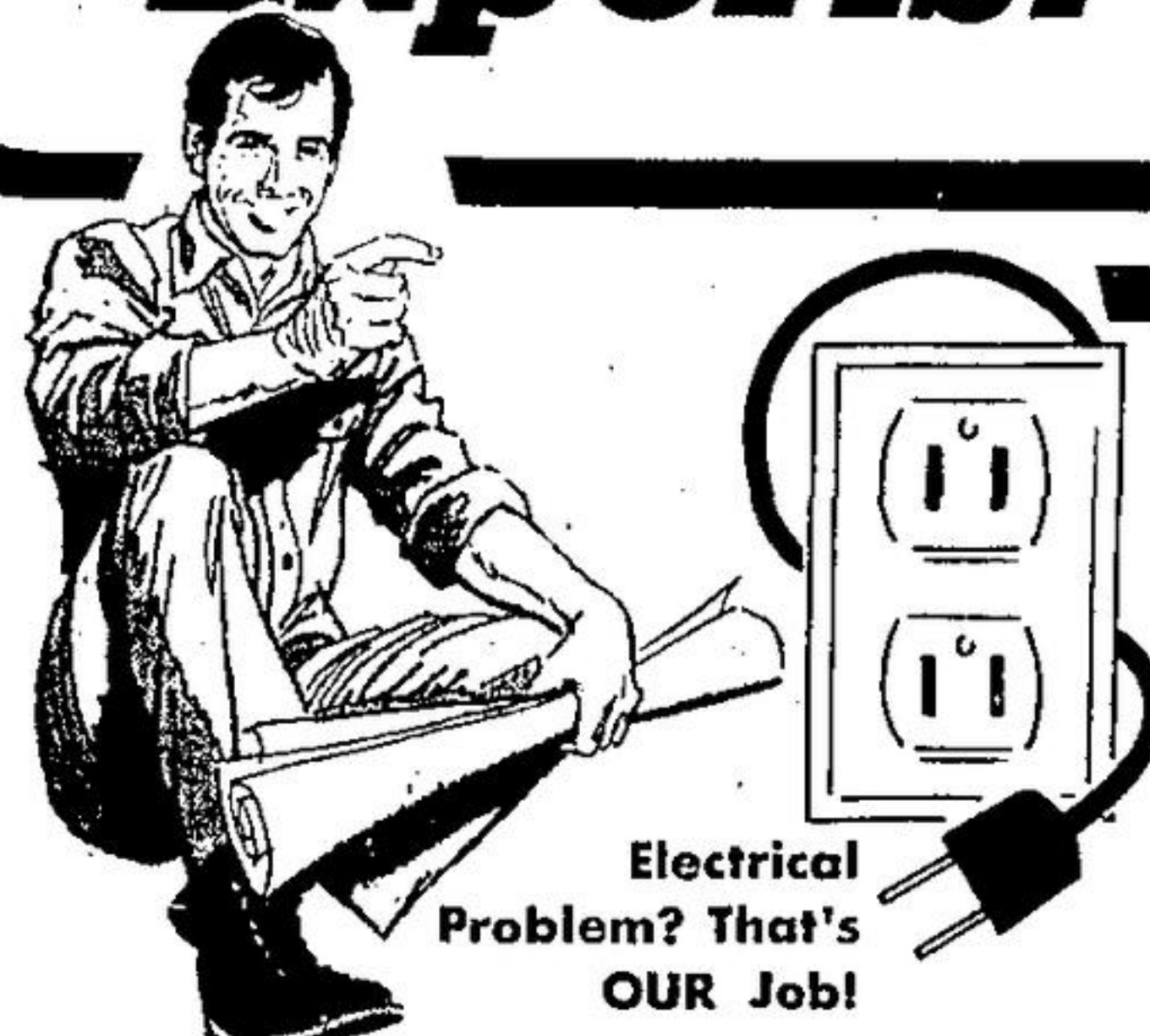
