get tax break

Senior citizen homeowners received an additional tax break from town council Monday evening.

Last June, seniors across the province paying taxes on their own homes became eligible for a provincial grant of \$500 or less, depending on the amount of taxes paid. Prior to Monday's regular

council meeting, seniors also received an additional \$150 from the town towards their municipal taxes, unamended, the bylaw offering the tax break could have cut down on the amount of money seniors received from the provincial government.

If a pensioner was paying \$575 in taxes, the \$150 municipal grant would reduce his tax bill to \$425, but the senior citizen would only receive \$425 from the province.

Under the newly amended bylaw, seniors become eligible for the municipal grant only if they have a tax bill of \$500 or more. In addition, the tax grant will be scaled to the amount which the tax bill exceeds \$500, up to \$150.

Although provincial tax grants are available to senior citizens renting homes or apartments, the municipal tax break is limited to home-

Team 'sets the record straight' on troubled Georgetown tournament

your paper so that we may set the record straight with respect to our Brampton team, dropped from your Georgetown Tournament last week.

All through the summer, our players have heard rumors that our team would not be invited back to play in this

ment. However, when we confronted Tournament Director Gerry Osborne, she denied this rumor and said we would be welcome to return as defending champions. When no invitation arrived, we delivered our entry payment to her home August 1. At that time, we were told that we were

definitely in the Tournament. but that a few teams had not responded to the invitation.

Between August 8 and 12, we were in constant touch with Gerry finding out what teams were in the Tournament and when our starting times were. It was not until 4 p.m., Tuesday, August 12, that we were told we had been dropped from playing in the Tournament.

The following reasons were given to us:

1. Brampton was the 13th team to enter and the Tournament could not be held with an odd number of teams. 2. A committee of five made

the decision. 3. Four local Georgetown teams would drop out if our team was allowed to partici-

4. Two players on the team who played with Glen Williams would wreck the Tournament. 5. Our Brampton team has stolen players from the Georgetown Industrial League.

We would like to answer the above points in the following manner:

1. There is no problem in running a Tournament with 13 teams and we explained this procedure to the Tournament Director. Our team was not the last team entered but was the first team dropped. Most other Tournaments respect status of defending champions from previous years.

2. No one has admitted to being


