Time to get ready for autumn elections

The municipal election has been set for November 10, clerk-administrator Ken Richardson told The Herald last week.

The clerk's office organizes municipal elections using guidelines established by legislation which sets out intervals during the campaign.

Nomination day is October 20, but the clerk's office will receive nominations for the

four days prior, from Thursday, October 18 to Monday, October 20, Mr. Richardson said. Candidates must have ten signatures on their nomination forms, which can be picked up from the clerk's office.

The advance poll will be held November 1. The voters' list will be posted on or before October 14; anyone not on the list can have their name added through the

clerk's office, but they can also be put on the list on election day, Mr. Richardson said.

On election day, a person not on the voters' list can go to his or her polling station, swear out a certificate, and then vote.

Ward 4 'best represented' with fewest meetings missed

If attendance figures compiled by the town clerk's department are any indication, voters in Wards 4 received the best representation from elected officials during 1980, while those in Wards 2 and 3 fared much worse.

Ward 4's Mike Armstrong, Harry Levy and Marilyn Serjeantson each missed only four meetings of town council, council's general committee and the planning board during the second year of their current term. By contrast, their Ward 2 colleagues missed a total of 26 meetings, as did those in Ward 3.

Ward 2's Pat Patterson, who was initially reluctant to seek re-election in 1978, missed six council meetings, five committee meetings and six board meetings between January 7 and August 25, 1980. At the other end of the attendance scale is his Ward 2 colleague, regional Coun. Russ Miller, who missed only one meeting throughout the year.
