Hundreds of fish were taken last week. Bronte has been producing Rainbow Trout, and off the cement plant at Clarkson, there have been lots of Lake Trout.

These lakers are in 40-45 feet of water and are holding to any type of structure they can find, and right on bottom. In fact we bounced a ball off the stones at one point and shortly thereafter had a Lake Trout hit.

Pete and Joan Masson hit Coho Friday and boxed nine on Saturday. Yours truly netted two Coho and a small Lake Trout.

NO SECRET LURE

The Coho Salmon I landed weighed 9.5 pounds and seemed to be the average. No special secret lure. All types of fish were hitting on a wide variety of rigs, yet we had the most success on Red Dodger with Half Pearl-Half Red Tom Mack Spoons.

Lots of fish are hitting light and releasing the lines from the downriggers. Maybe a check of the sharpness of the hook, as well as a hard strike after the hit will snag a few more of these light strikers.

The Brown Trout can be seen on the graph paper as they dive down from the vicinity of the cannonball. Of course the best method of getting into Brown Trout is to run a line on an outrigger or use a Yellow Bird side planer, which takes your line out and away from the area of the boat. Another method is to run about 50-100 feet of line from your ball and they "may" come back up for it.

Noticed a few people from Georgetown on the lake, why not give me a call and let me know how you are doing with the fish. It won't be long before the Rainbows start to head up the streams, and the Salmon start to come to shore for a final feeding binge before the spawning urge hits them and they do likewise. There are a lot of fish out there and things can not get anything but better.

Dale Wood of Credit River Boats has also been doing well and his wife Glenda caught a 9.17 pound Coho Saturday. Total for the day for Dale's boat was 5 with John Ollivier putting an 8.78 on ice using a Blue Johnsny on Red dodger.

OTHER NEWS

Construction of the fish pass at Streetsville should begin shortly. I know you have heard that one for some time, but negotiations are nearly complete. Construction will be carried out by the Ministry of Natural Resources and the Credit Valley Conservation Authority.

This dam and fish-way will be a barrier to the sea Lamprey and will also stop all salmon for egg collecting, while the Rainbow trout will be passed up. These fish will be unfishable as they will not be in until the season for trout closes and the Ministry will not extend the season for them.

The next barrier to trout will be the Reed Dam in Norval. However, the dam there now has a Denil Fishway installed and the work is finished or nearly so.

The Mill Dam at Georgetown is still under negotiation or study, no one seems to know which, but should be under way in 1981 seeing they did not get it started this year as they expected.
