3. Social Hour - come and enjoy a cup of tea and some 'goodies'; talk about your summer garden activities and your fall plans with your gardening friends.

NOW IS THE TIME
 Pick pears while a little green. Ripen indoors. Handle all fruits when picking as though they are as perishable as eggs. Slight bumps and bruises will tend to hasten rot.

Plan your spring flowering bulb garden now. Get your bulbs and planting area ready for action.

Make notes about flower and vegetable varieties that grew well in your garden so you can re-order next year.

DID YOU KNOW?
 Dehydrated foods take up far less storage space than their fresh, frozen or canned equivalents. Completely removing the water also eliminates the likelihood of spoilage. The prolonged life of perfectly dried fruits, herbs and vegetables is another reason for drying foods.

To sweeten your breath, chew on a whole clove, a bit of nutmeg, a leaf of mint or an anise seed, as your ancestors did for hundreds of years. So go ahead and have a feast of onion or garlic.
