

# Simon's 'Last of the Red Hot Lovers' begins GLT season Oct. 9-18

From the G.L.T. Georgetown Little Theatre members are well into production of their first play of the season, "The Last of the Red Hot Lovers," which debuts Oct. 9.

This very amusing story of a middle-aged man, who attempts to become another Don Juan before life passes him by, is by a well-known American playwright, author of some of the best comedies to hit the stage, Neil Simon.

Director Marie Cleaton, well known to Georgetown audiences for her versatility on stage, is demonstrating her range of ability and experience in directing. Her enthusiasm and energy are certainly shared by the cast and production crew.

Again, one of G.L.T.'s most energetic and competent producers, Jo Heed, is applying herself to the strenuous task of producing this opening play, accompanied by co-producer Linda McConagh.

Rehearsing with enthusiasm three nights a week are the four G.L.T. members who form the cast of this play. Ron Hunt has been seen many times on the Georgetown stage and is sure to delight audiences once again in the role of Barney.

Margaret Eggleton, Melissa Bell and Mary Goebel are the

## Folk from sea to sea at Oct. 29 concert

Three members of the Canadian folk group Maple Sugar were in Georgetown last week to tape an episode of the Halton Cable program "Magazine" and to give viewers a taste of the musical treat in store for them with the Halton Hills Arts Council "Trillight" concert series.

Maple Sugar's October 29 concert is the first of three shows sponsored by the arts council. The Tapestry Singers will be performing at Acton High School in February and Maureen Forrester will be performing at Georgetown District High School in April. Tickets are still available for

the series. The first concert, which will also be held at the Georgetown high school, will feature authentic Canadian folk songs, as performed by members of Maple Sugar.

The membership of the group is interchangeable, depending on the promoter's preferences in musical styles. For this concert, the performers will be James Gordon, Randy Sutherland, Jeff Bird, Dawson Girdwood and Gilles Losier.

Maple Sugar plays tunes from Newfoundland, Cape Breton, Acadia, Quebec, the Ottawa Valley, rural Ontario and the West. The troupe originally began as an educational project at the University of Guelph in 1973 with the release of an album called Maple Sugar. Dorothy and Homer Hogan had discovered a great deal of Canadian folk music which wasn't being heard and organized the group to make the recording. Different versions of the group have been touring together ever since, bringing the music to audiences across Canada.

Tickets for the concert series are available at Towels 'n' Things, Georgetown Fabric and other locations. Already broadcast twice last week on Halton's Cable 4 station, the show Magazine, featuring Maple Sugar, will appear again Oct. 2 at 6 p.m. and Oct. 10 at 7 p.m.
