Maple Sugar plays tunes from Newfoundland, Cape Breton, Acadia, Quebec, the Ottawa Valley, rural Ontario and the West. The troupe originally began as an educational project at the University of Guelph in 1973 with the release of an album called Maple Sugar. Dorothy and Homer Hogan had discovered a great deal of Canadian folk music which wasn't being heard and organized the group to make the recording. Different versions of the group have been touring together ever since, bringing the music to audiences across Canada.
