Tree planting offer

An ambitious tree-planting program by the Halt Region Conservation Authority will attempt to replace the hundreds of American elm trees but lost several years ago to Dutch elm disease. Rural landowners with a minimum of ten acres can apply to the Authority at 878-4131 to benefit from the late October program. Applications must be in by Oct. 10. In response to minimum orders of 25 trees, maximum 100, the Authority will plant the owner's choice of Sugar Maple, White and Mountain Ash or Carolina Poplar, each six to eight feet high, at a cost of \$4.50 per tree. Through a related project, seedlings from several species are available for planting at 2.5 cents each.

Patterson heads group

Hugh Patterson, chief purchasing agent for the town of Halt Hills since its incorporation in 1974 and deputy clerk-treasurer for the former town of Acton prior to that time, has been elected president of the Ontario Public Buyers Association, an organization of 100 individuals who make purchases for municipalities, libraries, schools and public utilities. The election took place at the Association's Sept. 17 through 19 annual conference in North Bay, which was highlighted by a speech from federal supply and services minister Jean Jacques Blais.
