MP explains small business bond program

By OTTO JELINER Halton MP (PC) SMALL BUSINESS DEVEL-

OPMENT BONDS The Small Business Development Bond program, originally introduced by the Progressive Conservative government and now re-introduced by the present administration, would allow qualifying Canadian small businesses to borrow funds at virtually one-half the current interest rate.

This measure, first introduced in the Crosbie budget last December 11, provides for qualifying small business corporations to take advantage of this form of financing as quickly as possible.

The measure proposed in the Ways and Means Motion Tabled in the House April 21, will reduce the cost of funds to qualifying small business corporations by enabling them to obtain low cost financing for development.

Under the measure, interest payments on a qualifying small business loan entered into after December 11, 1979 and before 1981 thus not be taxable to the corporate lenders, nor deductible to the small businesses. Since corporate lenders will incur no tax hability on the interest received, they will be able to reduce the rate of interest charged. For example, a bank or other financial institution that would otherwise pay income tax of 50 per cent on interest income should be able to reduce the rate of interest charged on the qualifying debt by up to

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible, a borrower must be a Canadian controlled private corporation that qualifies for the small business tax rate. Substantially all of the borrower's assets must be used in an active business carried on in Canada.

Qualifying debt will include all the usual forms of indebtedness. However, the principal amount of debt must be be-1ween \$10,000 and \$500,000 and the term to maturity of such debt must be at least one year but not more than five years. The draft legislation provides that a corporation or group of associated corporations can only have one qualifying debt or loan. Both the borrower and the lender will be required to jointly elect for the special treatment of the loan under

these provisions. Funds borrowed under a Small Business Development Bond must be used to make new capital investments or to finance research and development expenditures. For this purpose, eligible capital investments will generally include purchases of new depreciable property for use in the business carried on by the corporation in Canada. Property acquired for lease or rental to others, and automobiles, yachts, and executive jets will not qualify. In addition, small business corporations in financial difficulty will also be able to make use of the provision to obtain low-cost financing.

The draft legislation ensures that interest on borrowings used to finance the acquisition of Small Business Development Bonds would be fully deductible for tax purposes. Although this program must still be ratified by Parliament twhich is expected to take place by the end of October), a number of lending institutions are presently processing appli-




