Inadequate representation by incumbents has prompted new resident Wayne McLellan to challenge incumbent Ward 2 local Coun. George Maliby Nov. 10.

Mr. McLellan is a marketing sales manager for Allied Chemical Canada Ltd. in Mississauga, from where he moved six months ago.

From talking to fellow Ward 2 (Esquesing) residents, Mr. McLellan says he has found that many believe their wishes are being ignored by the current town council. In addition, he said, taxes here are comparable to those paid in Mississauga, whereas the level of municipal servicing is not even close. While Ward 2 residents may be satisfied with the services, he said, they are deeply concerned that their taxes do not reflect the level.

Mr. McLellan also wants to preserve Ward 2's rural identity, protecting it from encroaching urban development of the type dominating Peel's landscape.

"The last straw" for Derek Green of Georgetown was the possibility of a major regional sewer rate hike, but that's only one of his concerns.
