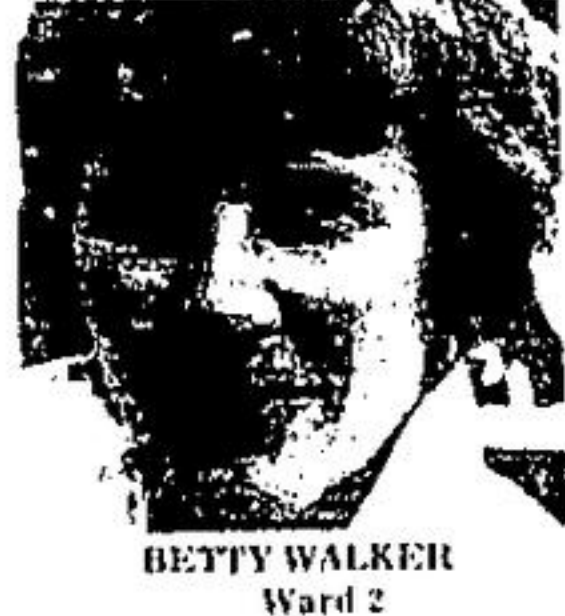

**Nomination deadline brings four new entries**

Four last-minute candidates split four different election races wide open Monday when the nomination deadline passed for the Nov. 10 municipal election.

Acclamations nevertheless remained the big story, as two regional councillors and all three Halton Board of Education candidates went unopposed and sailed into trusteeships. In addition, all three Ward 4

candidates - regional Coun. Mike Armstrong and local councillors Harry Levy and Marilyn Serjeantson were acclaimed along with rookie Mayor Pete Pomeroy, now ready for his second term.

Regional Coun. Roy Booth will retain his Ward 3 seat, but local incumbents Walter Blehn and John McDonald face a campaign battle against newcomers Derek Green and Dave Barrager.

Ward 1 regional Coun. Ed Wood has one challenger, former candidate Dave Whiting. Ward 1 local councillors Terry Grubbe and Russ Knechtel were acclaimed.

Ward 2 regional Coun. Russ Miller faces two opponents, Peter Branch and Dolly Moulden, while his colleague at the local level, George Maltby, is being opposed by Nick Hunsley, Pam Sheldon and Wayne McLellan.

Irene McCauley was unopposed in her candidacy for the town's only seat on the Halton Separate School Board until nomination day, when fellow Actonian Vince Whelan came forward to challenge.

**Our mistake**

Assembling all those head-and-shoulder shots of Halton Hills' 25 municipal candidates and acclaimed representatives regrettably proved too much for us Tuesday and two of the

names accompanying photos were switched. Though Wayne McLellan's photo appeared correctly among the Ward 2 local candidates, his name was

switched with that of Derek Green, a Ward 3 local candidate. The Herald regrets the error and offers readers the following brief summaries of the two candidates.

**Rural taxes out of line for services: McLellan**



Inadequate representation by incumbents has prompted new resident Wayne McLellan to challenge incumbent Ward 2 local Coun. George Maltby Nov. 10.

Mr. McLellan is a marketing sales manager for Allied Chemical Canada Ltd. in Mississauga, from where he moved six months ago.

From talking to fellow Ward 2 (Esquimes) residents, Mr. McLellan says he has found that many believe their wishes are being ignored by the current town council. In addition, he said, taxes here are comparable to those paid in Mississauga, whereas the level of municipal servicing is not even close. While Ward 2 residents may be satisfied with the services, he said, they are deeply concerned that their taxes do not reflect the level.

Mr. McLellan also wants to preserve Ward 2's rural identity, protecting it from encroaching urban development of the type dominating Peel's landscape.

**Peel policeman Green annoyed by rate hike**



"The last straw" for Derek Green of Georgetown was the possibility of a major regional sewer rate hike, but that's only one of his concerns.

The Peel regional policeman moved from England some years ago and has since been active with the Lions Club and the Canadian Cancer Society. He'll challenge incumbents Walter Blehn and John McDonald and new candidate Dave Barrager for the Ward 3 local seat.


An avowed conservationist, Mr. Green would like to see such municipal programs as Divide and Conquer, the garbage source separation program, expanded. He also advocates improved transit facilities for the town and region.
