#### Curtains for music festival

Herald Special The North Halton Music Festival is a thing of the past. Those concerned with the future of the festival agreed last Wednesday at M.Z. Bennett school that the festival could not continue.

School principal and festival association chairman Doug Magwood said only seven people turned out for the

This was indicative of the sort of effort teachers were prepared to spend on the festival although about 26 schools, including the Georgetown District Christian Schools and the separate schools were all eligible to participate in the

festival, he said. The 51-year-old event was not in financial difficulty, he said. The festival has a bank

balance of \$1,600. The Halton board of education paid transportation costs for students to attend the festival and without their board support, the money would be used up in transportation costs in one year.

A survey of schools completed since September indicated that only a handful of teachers would be willing to take an active role in perpetuating the event and only half the schools would participate.

The event was called off for a year in 1980 to give organizers time to determine its support and possible courses of action for the future. The possibility of turning it into a Kiwanis Festival with support from the Georgetown Kiwanis Club was suggested but did not materialize.

"I'm not happy with it," Mr. Magwood sald, "but I can accept it. The response indicated pretty clearly it would be an exercise in fulfilly to

continue." Many schools have turned to operettas and concerts in which large numbers of students participate, he said. Therefore they haven't the time to devote to festival preparation and these activitien also.


