Acton high school teacher Harold Swallow will end 34 years of teaching Oct. 31. Mr. Swallow has taught in Acton for 13 years. He and his wife live at R13, Acton.

He came to the school as head of the history department in 1967 but gave up the extra work load involved when the reorganization of the system merged history and geography into social science about six years ago.

His career began in Sarnia Collegiate Institute where he taught mathematics, English, history and health. He also taught in a private school for a time.

He came to Acton to teach because he wanted to work in a small school where a teacher gets to know his students.

Mr. Swallow grew up in Corning, Saskatchewan, but moved to Niagara Falls, Ontario, in 1934. He and his wife have no children but being "part of the Swallow clan" makes up for it. Four of his six brothers and sisters will be present for a farewell party the school staff are having for him in Knox Presbyterian Church Tuesday.

Mr. Swallow says he hopes to become more involved with church work after his retirement. He has taught Bible classes for several years and has worked with an adult study group at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Guelph.

He is also interested in photography and will be travelling to England for six weeks next spring.
