The show will run from November 16 to December 21, when the gallery closes for the winter. The gallery is open from noon to 5 p.m. Saturday, Sunday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

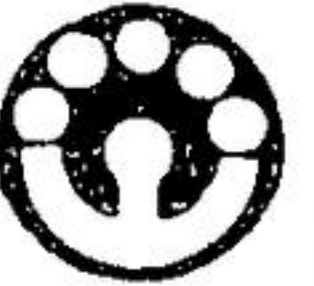
the actors who get to stand on stage and receive applause. There are a lot of backstage people the audience will never see who deserve standing ovations."

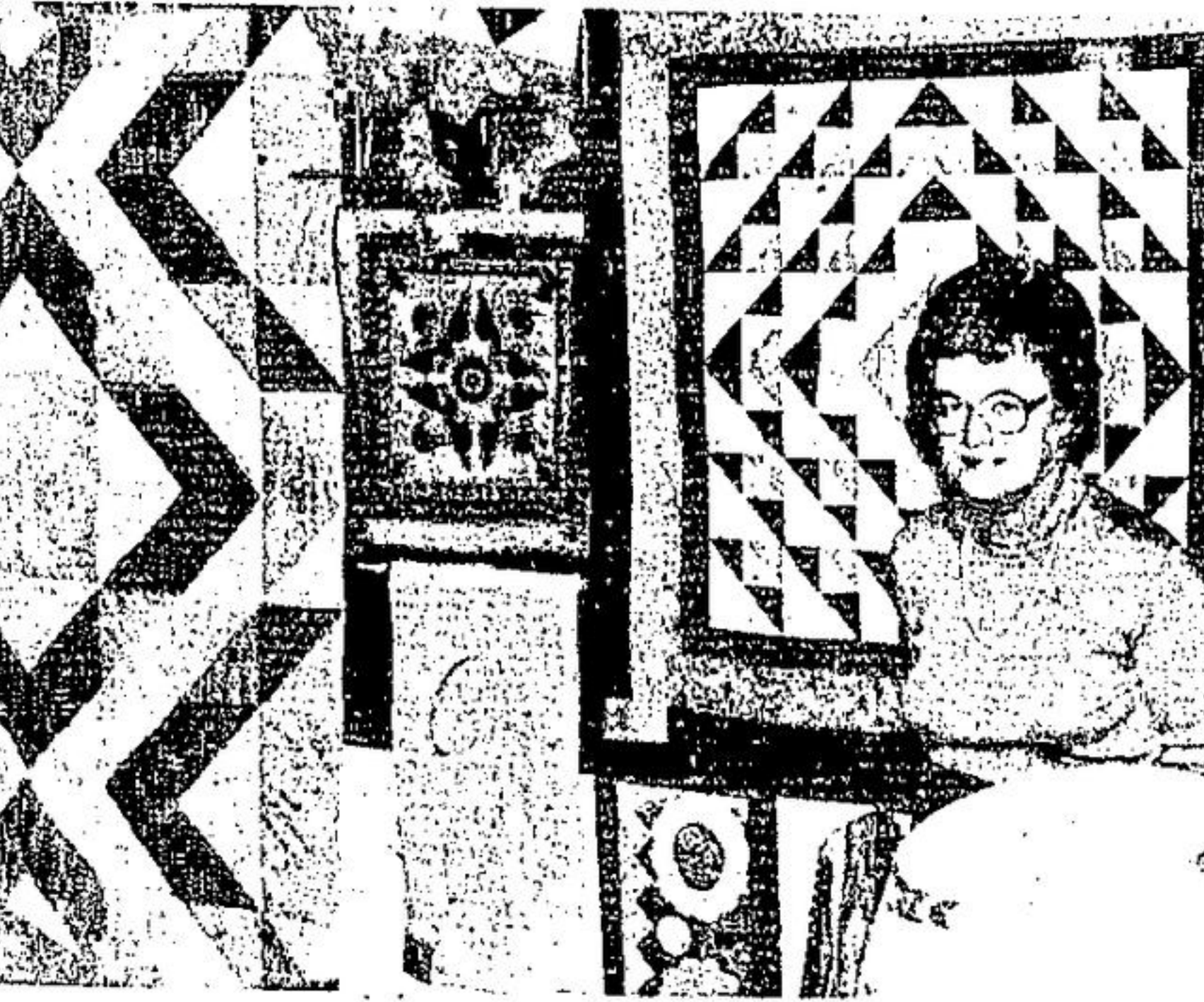

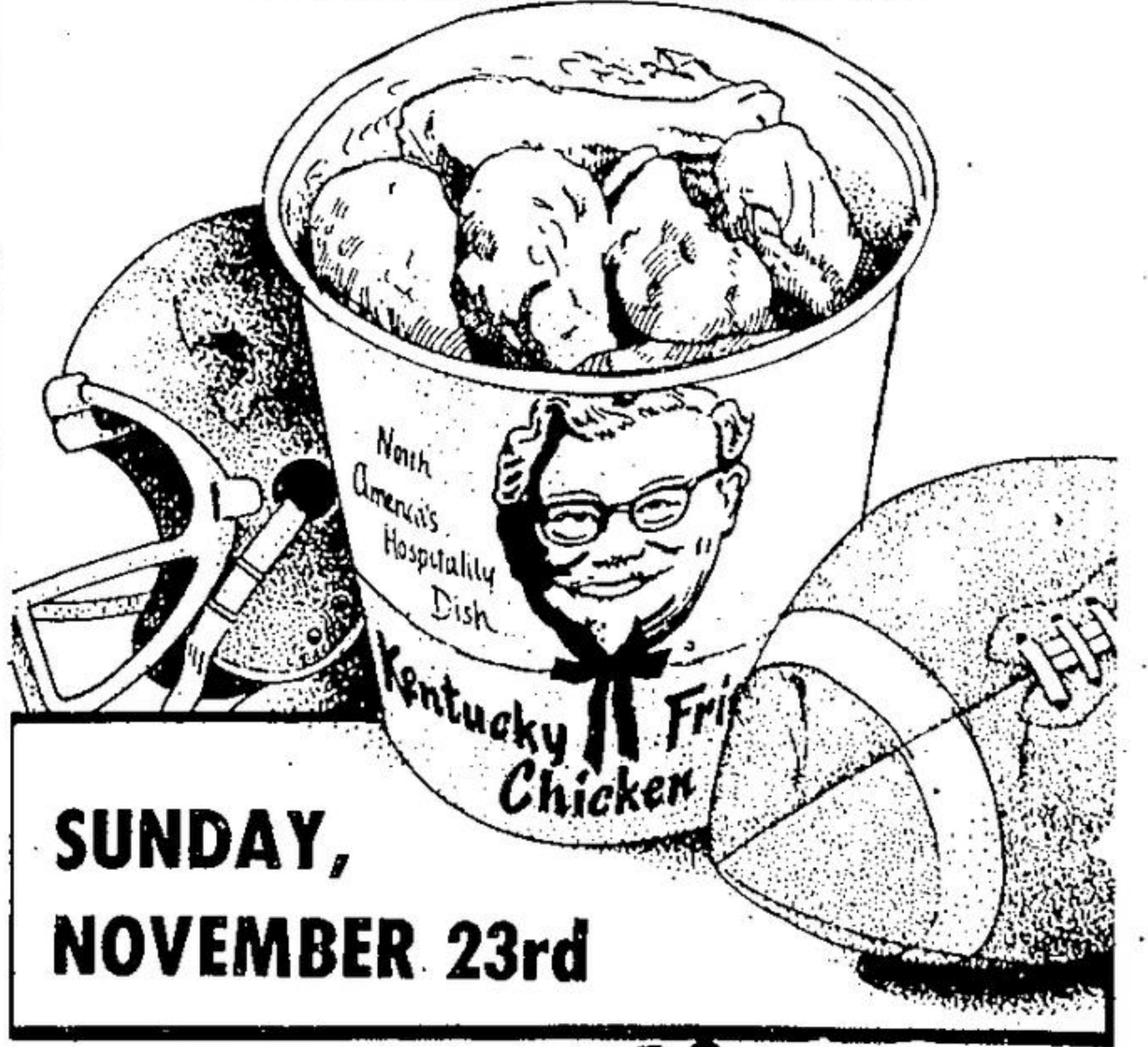
