Scouts roll into high gear

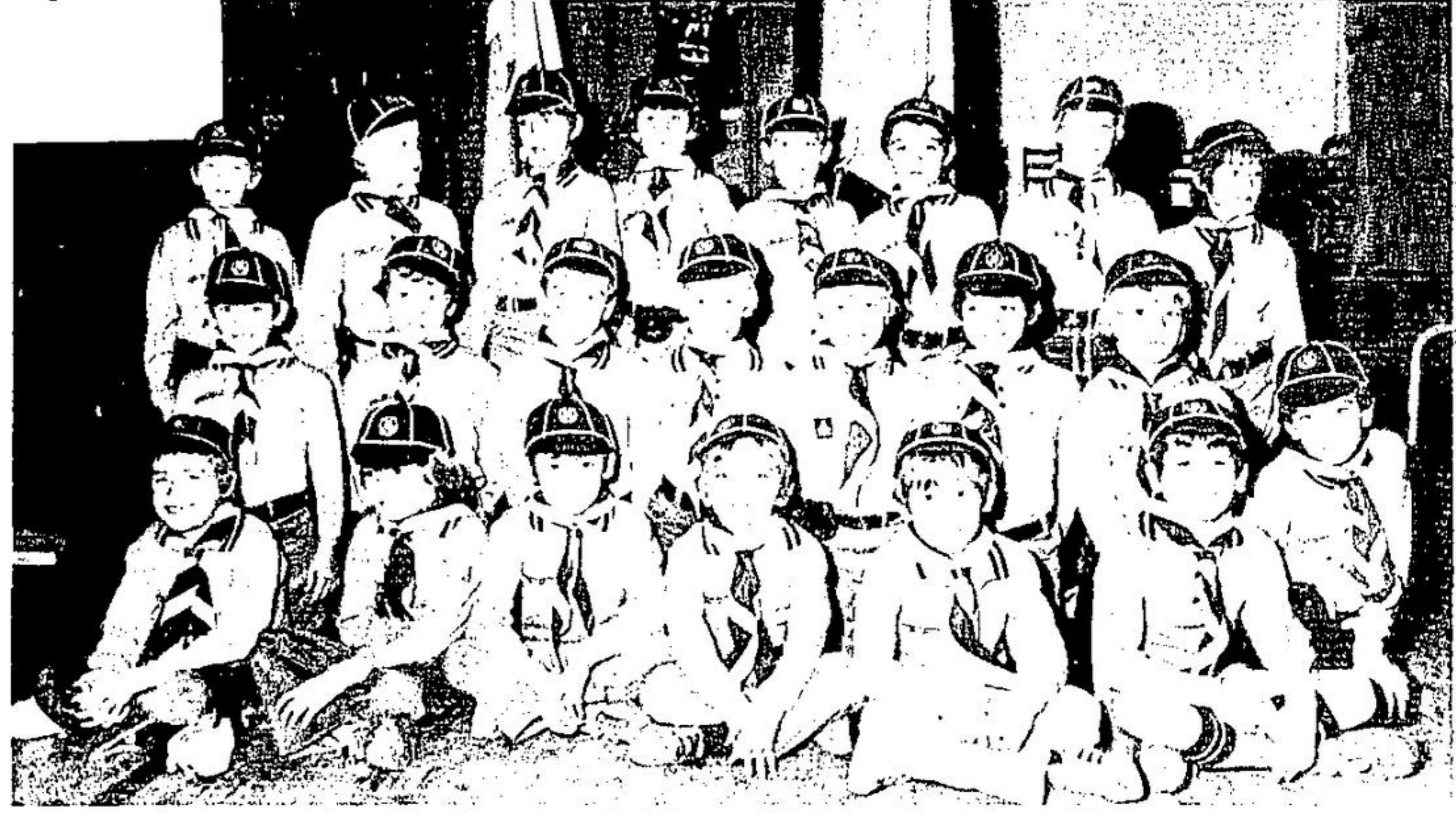
