Although Sam Tennant's doctor won't let him return to finish his final week of work after he spent last week in a Guelph hospital, he won't retire officially until Friday.

Mr. Tennant joined the town of Acton works crew in February, 1954, according to town records. He also served 35 years with the town's volunteer firefighters until he retired in January.

Mr. Tennant moved to Acton from Stewarttown in 1941 and has lived in his Wellington Street home with his wife and son since 1955.

When he first joined the Acton works crew there were only five men on it, he says. Those five did everything, water and sewers, town maintenance, snow plowing and sanding streets, parks, arena and cemetery maintenance and even dug graves by

Mr. Tennant is proud of the record the crew established to always have streets cleaned out after a storm so that people could get cars out to go to work the next morning. Many's the night they worked 24 hours straight to accomplish it.


