The Georgetown Choral Society has a history of ambitious musical undertakings, but it appears that with Festival Noel, they've set a standard they'll have a hard time

The concert was actually a joint effort with the Cantante Singers. Accompaniement was provided by organist Gerry Van Wyck and an orchestra of young musicians from Toronto, many of whom are members of the Toronto Youth Symphony Orchestra, Cheryl Hauser also accompanied the Cantante Singers.

The concert Saturday was in Knox Presbyterian Church, but on Sunday for the first time, the Society ventured into Milton's Holy Rosary Church.

The three-part program be-gan with "Midnight Mass for Christmas Eve" by Marc-Antoine Charpentier, featuring soloists Anna Burke, Mary-Jane McGinn, Carolyn Simmons, Simon Edwards, Martin

Veltman and Bill Brush. The Mass is scored for soloists, flutes, strings and organ, and is based on French Christmas carols. The words, of course, were in Latin, and added to the majesty of the proceedings.

SOUND LOST The acoustics in Holy Rosary Church were fairly good overall, but at times the soloists' voices seemed to get lost in the sanctuary. Unfortunately, there were also times when Mr. Van Wyck's organ was lost under the string

The second part of the program featured the Cantante Singers with soloist Carolyn Simmons singing "Magnificat" by Ralph Vaughn Williams. "Magnificat" describes Mary's experience in music. The music features exchanges between Mary and the chorus. It is at times a sombre piece, but it is most fittingly described as a haunting melody.

The solos by Ms. Simmons showed up to more advantage here than they did in the Mass. The performance by the Cantante Singers was good, as the singers performed with intense concentration.

Before the program was concluded, the orchestra had a chance to demonstrate its talents with a performance of Vivaldi's Concerto No. 3. The concerto made for a change-ofpace in the program and gave the chorus a chance to catch its breath before the final part of the program began,

"O Come All Ye Faithful" was a joint effort, with the audience being invited to sing along in the last verse. "Once in Royal David's City" sounded a gentler note, leading into "Silent Night".

The last carol, "Angels We Have Heard on High", featured both groups of singers, and an enchanting echoing effect among the various components of the choir. It made for a pleasing finish to the evening.

Although society director Dale Wood expressed his appreciation for the turn-out in the group's first venture into Milton, attendance was not
