

# Selects tournament brings trophy to Georgetown

A last minute invitation to attend the second annual Hillsburgh PeeWee Tournament resulted in the Georgetown Selects winning the consolation finals, bringing home the trophy and individual player medallions.

Eight teams were invited from local towns to participate in a well-run tournament. Playing O.P.S. Township in the first match, Georgetown lost 4-2, although it was a tie game of 2-2 well into the third period. Goal scorers were Mike Ross and Jim Carpenter, with assists from Robbie Cooper on both goals.

Georgetown won the second game 2-1 over Embro in a hard-fought contest, with Georgetown continually carrying the play, and peppering shots at the Embro goalkeeper, who kept them in the game, and won their most Valuable Player award.

Georgetown's Most Valuable Player was Rod Froehler. Goal scorers were Brad Klavkals, assisted by Lance Reid, and Robbie Cooper unassisted. The third and final game against Honeywood was a cliff hanger, won by Georgetown at 5:18 of an overtime period, by a score of 3-2. Both teams, although tired, pumped out many end-to-end rushes and a second-effort determination in a see-saw battle. The referees called 12 minor infractions.

## Bowling for Colt 45

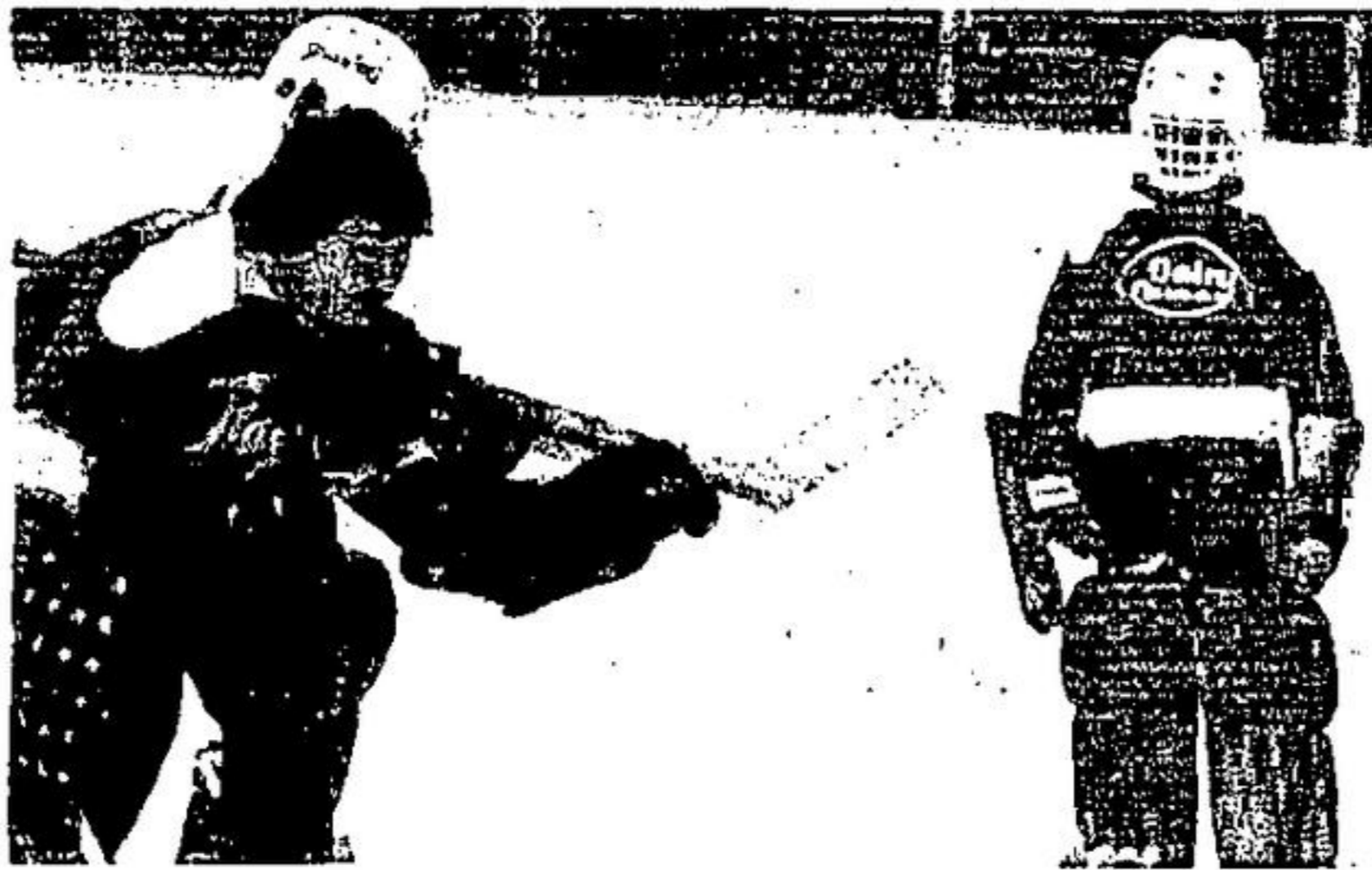

# Those unsung heroes Program for young goalies

The minor hockey people in Georgetown have a development program for only two players of each team, but those two players haven't always been getting the special attention they deserve.

Every Sunday at Gordon Aleart from 12:00 to 1:00 p.m., there is a goalie clinic for those unsung heroes between the pipes.

Greg Netten, 22, is an instructor with his dad, John for the 12 week clinic. John says goalkeepers need special attention that coaches are not always able to devote to their goalkeepers. He says goalkeepers must skate with the other

kids on the team and then face many hard shots during shooting practice, when in fact the goalies are very tired. "Sometimes the goalies are too tired to stop the puck, and that is when they get injured," Greg says.

The father and son team are volunteer instructors, and do not get paid for their time in helping the 30 odd youngsters. Not usually turn out for the clinic. Netten says that the clinic has the capacity for another 30 goalkeepers in Georgetown if any are interested.

The instructors teach the youngsters the basics of goalkeeping, such as how to move, how to stop the puck the right way, proper angles to block a shot and proper equipment. Greg was instructed by experts from the George McGrattan Goalkeeping school in Scarborough for eight years. His dad was good friends with the instructor of the McGrattan school and he himself picked up some valuable knowledge of goalkeeping skills.

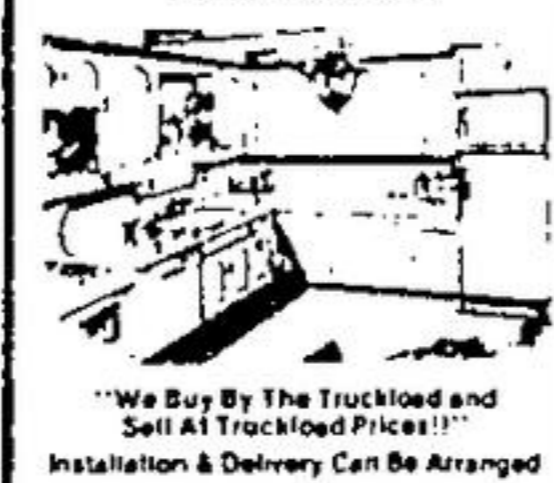

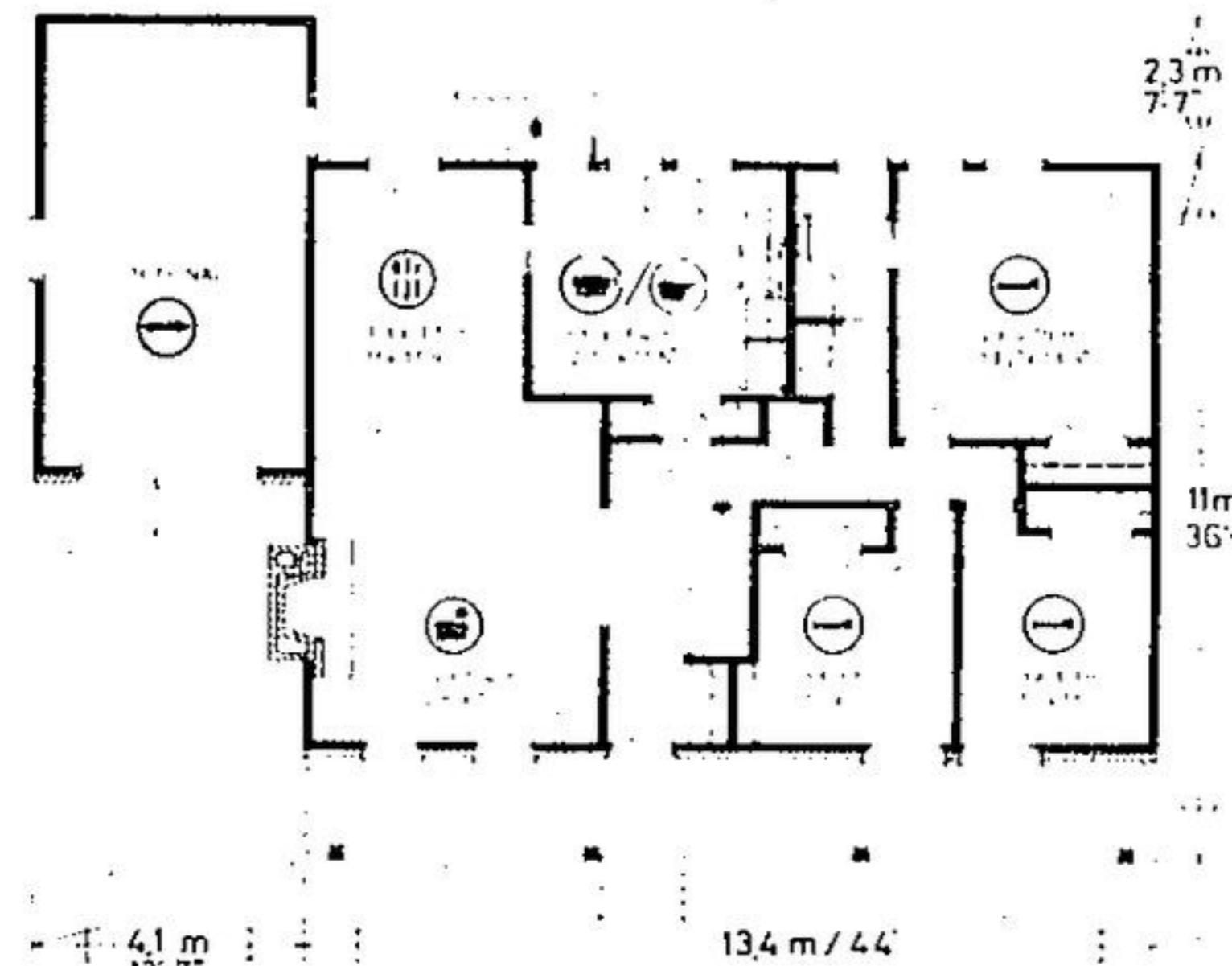

### RANCH-STYLE BUNGALOW WITH FULL BASEMENT

This low-profile, ranch house style bungalow is perfectly suited to the medium frontage residential building lot, and contains in excess of 1,300 square feet of finished floor area, which would make an ideal home for the medium-size family. The solid, comfortable-appearing exterior, finished in horizontal channel siding, fieldstone veneer and chimney, shutter-accented windows and full-width verandah, with heavy shake roof, may be constructed either with or without the optional garage. The shake roofing may be replaced with the more traditional and economical shingles for those who prefer.

The verandah-covered entry leads directly into a compact reception foyer and closet storage area, from whence, traffic moves naturally left into the large rectangular living-dining room combination. The living room features a centrally-positioned, cantilevered-hearth masonry fireplace and excellent natural lighting. The dining room separates from the kitchen-dinette via space-saving pocket door, for privacy and easy access when entertaining.
