



Continued from page A5 immediately prior to the scheduled opening of the new complex, and a special arts lottery in 1982.

"We don't propose to start the lottery until then in order to avoid any conflict with Actario," Mrs. Day explained.

Arts Council membergroups which have begun actively considering their own fund-raising events include the University Women's Club, which is planning an Historical House Tour, and the Georgetown Choral Society which has established a special fundraising committee. George-town Little Theatre, a founding member of the Arts Council, is conducting a separate campalgn and has thus far raised \$23,000 towards its goal of \$30,000.

"All in all, we are very pleased at the response and interest of our membergroups. We are therefore very hopeful that the different activilles of the arts community in Halton Hills will have a large impact on the overall fund-raising drive," Mrs. Day said.

Georgetown Rotary Club -the third community organization to publicly pledge a fivefigure fund-raising goal - is planning four major fundraising activities in 1901.
