Milton parents' search for daughter may end

Canadian Embassy staff have advised a local family not to return to Mexico in search of their 14-year-old daughter who disappeared there 10 months ago.
Two weeks ago, Conrad and Frances Sweet were asked to go to Ottawa to talk to government staff prior to a planned departure to renew their search for their missing daughter Cathy.
Mrs. Sweet was told more could be done from Canada than could be achieved by returning to Mexico. Officials promised to step up efforts to

find the girl who disappeared while the family was holidaying at San Miguel de Allende in February.
Mrs. Sweet said the FBI is also involved, taking a more active role in the investigation, but she did not explain how.
The FBI was originally called in to investigate the disappearance of the uncle of a Mexican boy thought to be connected to Cathy Sweet's disappearance. The uncle, who lived in the United States, has never been found.
Mrs. Sweet said the family was advised against hiring a private detective and told

more would probably be uncovered if a radio or television public affairs program specializing in investigative reporting was given the information.
"I usually love Christmas," Mrs. Sweet said, her voice breaking. "We always had such fun getting ready. This year there are too many reminders of Cathy."
Mrs. Sweet is convinced her daughter has been forced into white slavery.
