

Chemicals help out-fox Jack Frost

Hot chocolate and blazing fires won't be the only things keeping out the winter chills this season, thanks to Canada's chemical technology which converts petroleum and natural gas into common textiles.

About two-thirds of the clothing you wear is made from synthetic fibres, everything from long underwear (made from acrylic), to your bright new ski jacket (polyester, nylon, acetate). Synthetic fibres, which are derivatives of petrochemicals, have many advantages: some are wrinkle and crush resistant, others are tough, durable and water-repellant, most make excellent insulators.

Many man-made textiles are foam around the house, too. The plush carpet that aces your toes from cold floors those frosty mornings, or the seat covers in your car while you wait for your engine to warm up, all help to keep Jack Frost from nipping at your heels.

Canada's \$8.6 billion textile industry is largely concentrated in smaller cities in Ontario and Quebec. It's a labour-intensive industry employing 74,000 people. In many of these areas, the industry is often the sole or main employer, particularly for semi-skilled and unskilled workers.

According to the Canadian Chemical Producers' Association, the industry is highly dependent on prim-

ary chemicals such as butadiene, propylene, benzene and ethylene which are refined from petroleum and upgraded into synthetic fibres. Polyester, at one stage in the upgrading process, is merely ethylene glycol, more commonly known as anti-freeze.

Chemicals make car efficient

The modern car has become a chemical laboratory on wheels -- and it's safer and more energy efficient, to boot! The next time you sit behind the wheel, remember that several chemicals are riding along with you, such as: butadiene, ethylene glycol, polyethylene resins, benzene, styrene, and cyclohexane.

These and other chemical derivatives, reports the Canadian Chemical Producers' Association, end up in your car as windshield wipers, washer fluid, anti-freeze, and fuel additives for better mileage.

Steel-belted tires and seatbelts, also made from chemicals, have greatly reduced the number of highway accidents and saved countless lives. These parts of your car are as essential to road safety as your steering wheel and braking system, which also contain chemicals.




