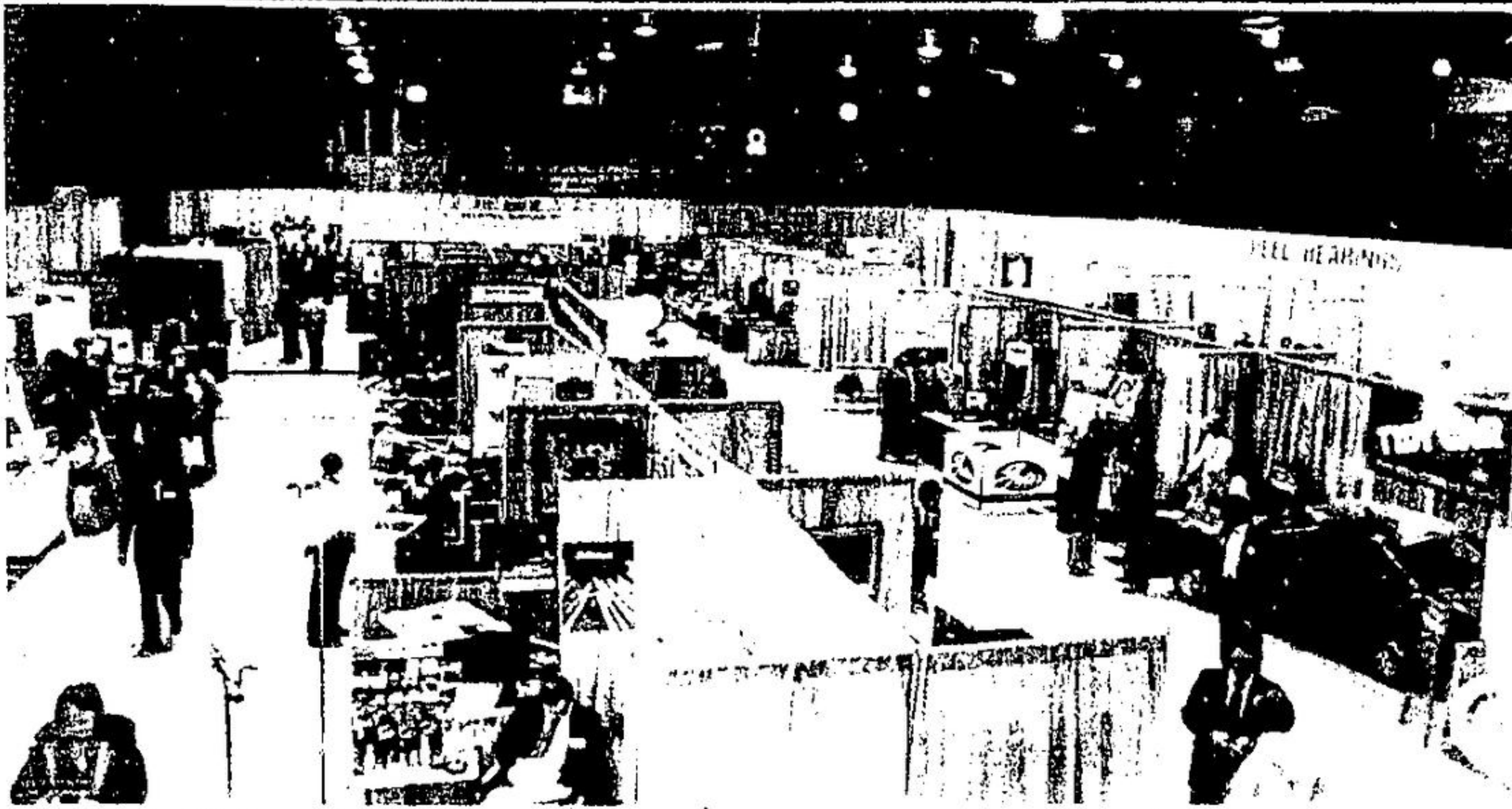


1980 - THE YEAR IN PHOTOS

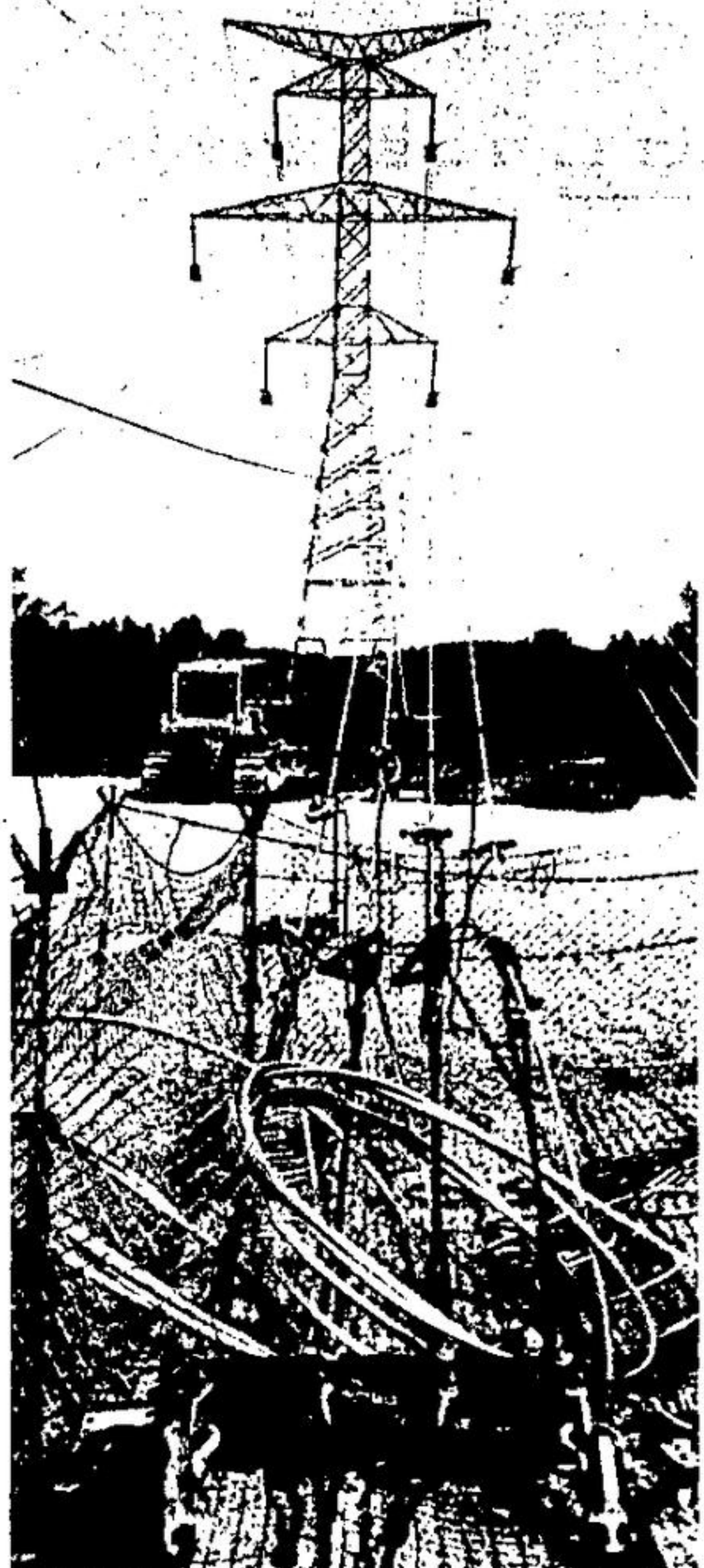
booths, Industry '80 was a successful and exciting new thrust in area business promotion. Ontario labor minister Robert Elgie opened the show, expected to become an annual event.
