A few tickets are still available for the New Year's Party.

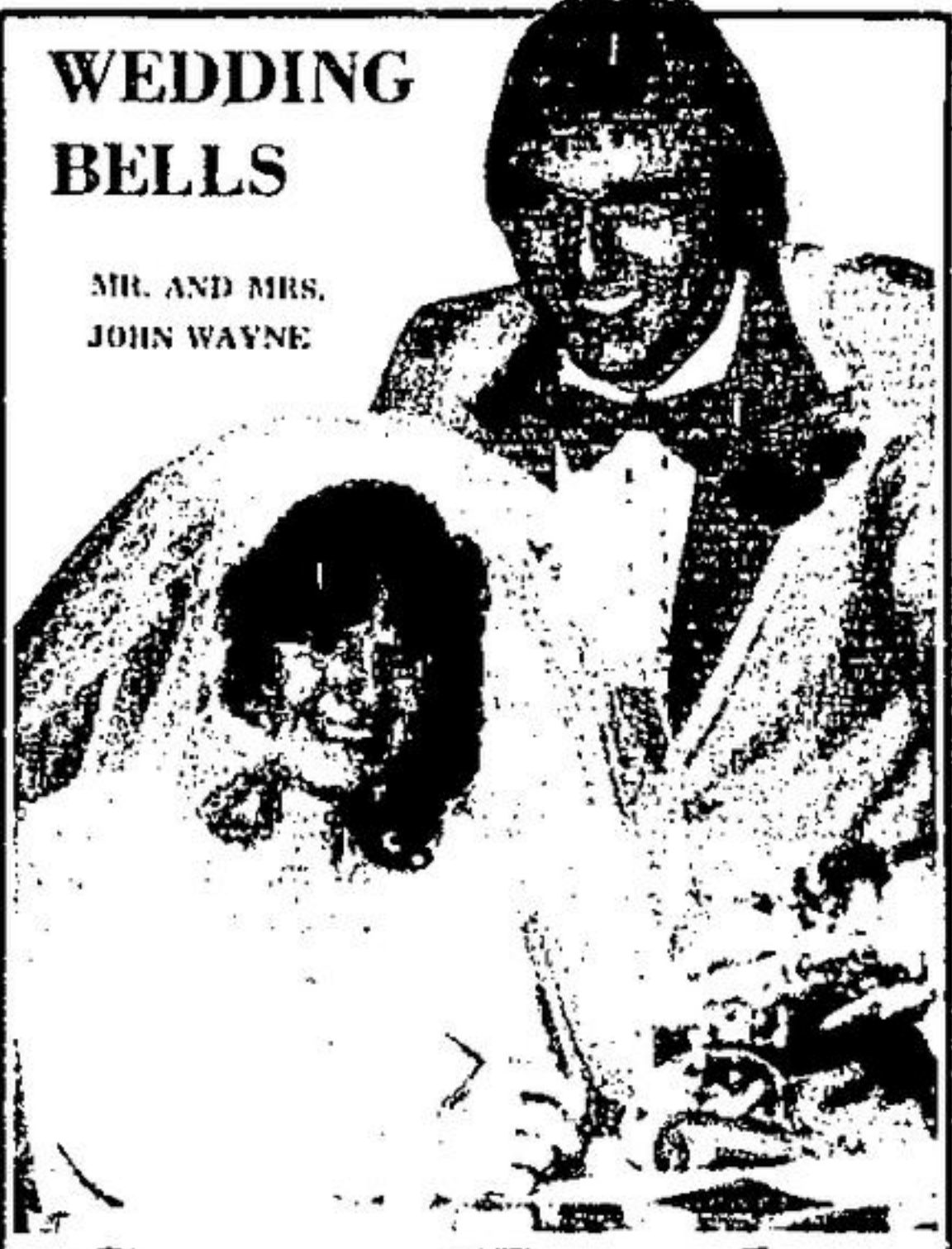
Limehouse Christmas pageants at the schools
