Demolition was Chateau Belair's final solution to the problem of what to do with Chapel Street Public School in Georgetown. In July, after more than a year of revising plans for the site's redevelopment, the firm threw up its hands and razed the century-old structure. Its school facilities closed several years earlier during the province-wide phase-out of small school buildings. First a rest home for seniors, then an apartment building, had been proposed for the old school, but council, which had declined to buy the building itself, remained unimpressed by proposals.

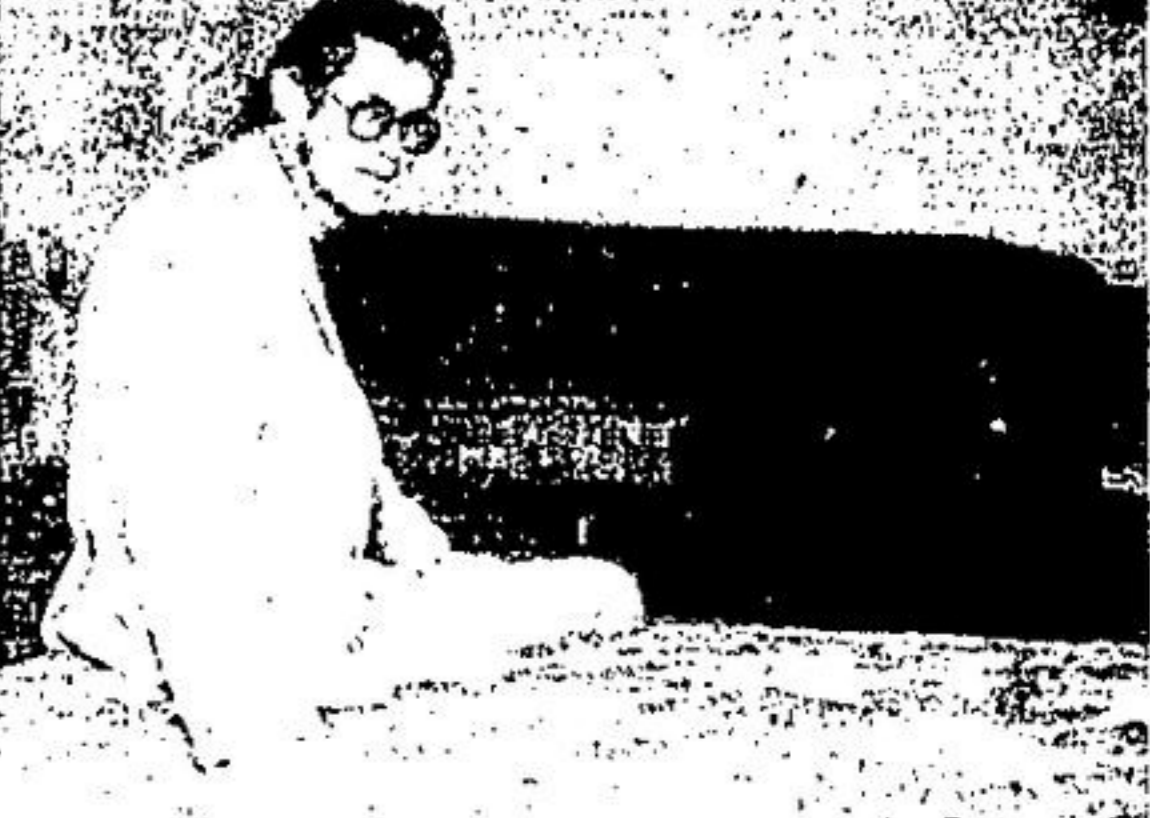
