
the plan," Mr. Crawford emphasized that the town must have control over industrial and residential development to prevent an imbalance from causing problems.

Under the overall direction of Mrs. Irvine, Marion Mc-Candless and Maureen Rees (accounting), Lynn Clark and Lee Wolff (typing) and Cathy Ganton (printing) joined library workers Sally Baines, Elise Mosher, Alison Ritchie and Lynn Simioni in pulling together an attractive publication which includes a short history of the library by former chief librarian Marjorie Nazer, a pen and ink drawing of the old library by Bob Law. and artwork by librarian Judi Starkey.

The selection of recipes -- all "test-tasted" .. comprise "Main Dishes", "Odds and Sods", and "Desserts", Mrs. Irvine said 800 copies were printed, but so far only about 200 have been sold, barely covering production costs.
