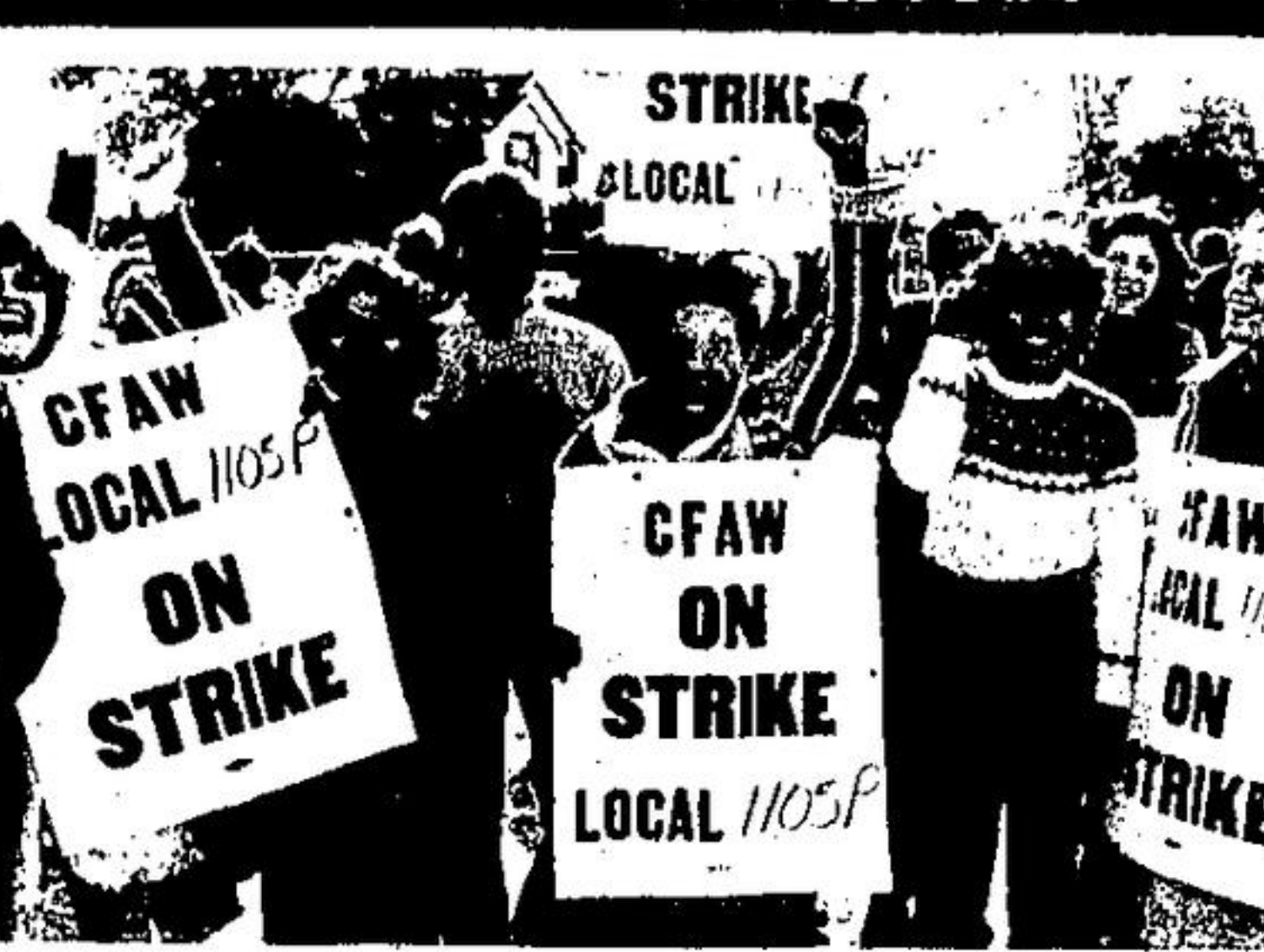

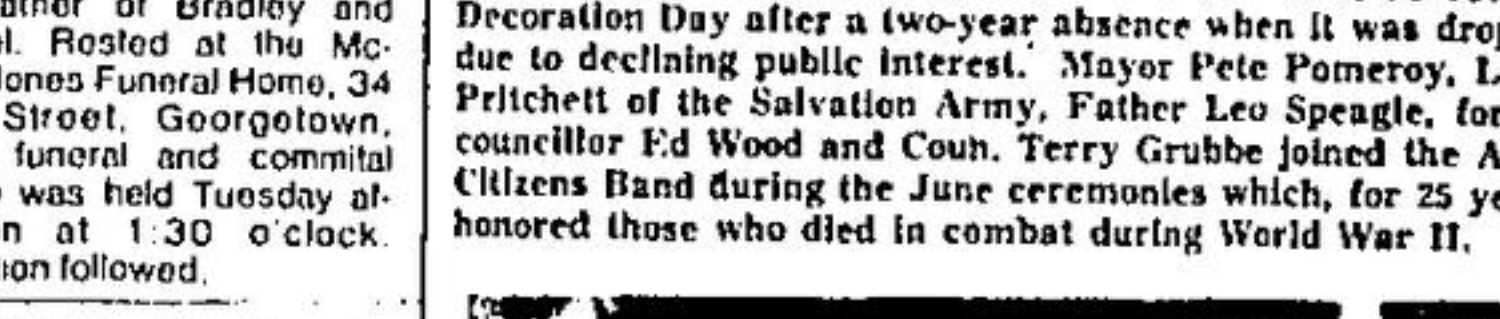
More than 300 Maple Lodge employees were out on strike through most of September as the United Food and Commercial Workers Union's Local 1105 sought an 80-cent per hour pay increase for its members. Internal strife both before and during the strike has resulted in a record number of grievances being brought before the Ontario Labor Board, which now has a hearing in session.



Mayor Pete Pomeroy purchased the first seat plaque from John Roe to kick off Georgetown Little Theatre's \$30,000 fund-raising drive for the new library-cultural centre last April. The drive has collected about two-thirds of its goal. Mayor Pomeroy, meanwhile, wins The Herald's "Diplomat of the Year" award for personally donating \$1,150 each to Acton's town hall restoration campaign and the library-cultural centre project.
