

**Norton severance fees**

# Region votes to appeal OMB ruling

A Halton Hills man may still have to cover the cost of his recent land separation hearing despite an Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) decision ordering Halton region to do so.

Supporting a resolution drafted by Burlington Coun. Joan Allingham, regional council voted 16-7 last Wednesday to appeal to the provincial Cabinet against an Oct. 27 OMB decision which awarded Esquimes resident Harry Norton \$3,000 in legal fees following his unsuccessful attempt to have a land separation approved.

Mr. Norton had been trying, since November, 1979, to get a severance from his 55-acre property on Highway 25 south of Acton to use as a hedge against inflation.

"I've never asked anyone to pay my legal fees," Mr. Norton told The Herald Sunday. "I just want to get my separation."

payer in the region," Coun. Mannell said. "It would be totally wrong to accept the blame when in fact we have been consistent throughout."

Mr. Norton's severance was the last on a list of three similar requests which were endorsed by regional council in September. Council decided to appeal only against his application to the OMB, despite the planning committee's approval of the proposal.

"This has been a numbers game from day one," Halton Hills Coun. Mike Armstrong said, acting as regional chairman for vacationing Jack Ruffus. "Two of them were passed and one wasn't."

Halton Hills councillors have strongly backed his case, Mr. Norton said Sunday. Neighbors have not objected to his severance plans, he said, adding that the property is too rugged to be used as farmland.

- LICENSE FEES ARE AS FOLLOWS:  
1. Female or male — \$12.00  
2. Spayed female or Neutered male — \$9.00  
3. Kennel License — \$25.00

In accordance with By-law 74-45 and its amendments, every owner of a dog on or before the 15th day of February of each year, or within 7 days of becoming the owner of a dog after the 15th day of February, shall register each dog with the collector and apply to him for a license and tag for each dog.

Every person who fails to comply with Section 2 or Section 7 of this By-law is guilty of an offense and upon conviction is liable to a fine of not more than Fifty (\$50.00) dollars exclusive of costs, and every such fine shall be recoverable under the provisions of the Summary Convictions Act, R.S.O. 1970.

Every resident of the Town of Halton Hills owning a bicycle shall obtain a license before using such bicycle or allowing it to be used on any highway in the Town of Halton Hills.

A license may be obtained by applying to the Municipal Offices of the Town of Halton Hills, located at 36 Main Street South, Georgetown, and 40 Mill Street East, Acton, Monday - Friday 9:30 - 4:30 and also at North Halton Sports, 71 Main Street South, Georgetown, during store hours.

A Bicycle License obtained effective 1981 is valid to the person to whom it is issued and is not transferable, and further no license is required in subsequent years unless there is a change of ownership.

When applying for your Bicycle License we require the make of the bicycle, the manufacturer's serial number and your name and address.
