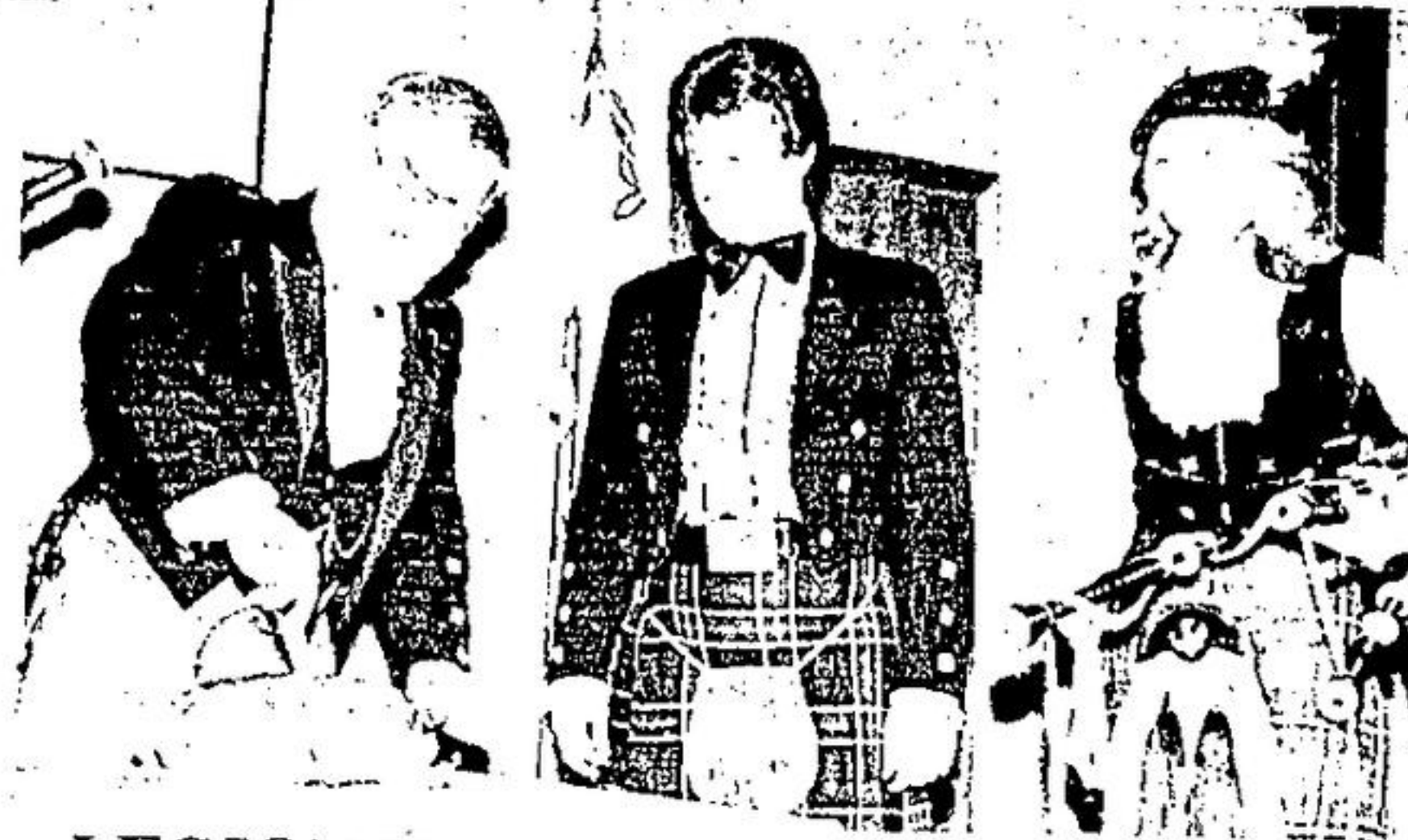
On Jan. 2, the Women's Institute met for its Citizenship and World Affairs meeting in Hillcrest Church, with Mrs. James McPhail as hostess.
