The International Association of Lions Clubs is the largest single service organization in the world today with 33,970 clubs located in more than 150 countries and geographical areas. Total membership exceeds 1,300,000.

The Lions Club of Georgetown is a very active member of the Association and currently has a membership of 47.

Meetings are held in the Georgetown Lions Hall every Tuesday night, with the first and third meetings being general membership dinner meetings, comprised of entertainment, fellowship and minimal business. The



second and fourth Tuesdays are directors' meetings, which are open to the general membership and are strictly business.

Lions come from every walk of life, whether manager, doctor, lawyer, truck driver or shift worker. They are your neighbors who join together in a common bond to serve community, country or the world. Lions can be found working together on many exciting projects.

Whether helping the poor in far-off lands, building schools, recreation centres or helping the blind, the common goal of Lionism can be summed up in our motto "We Serve".

Lions Clubs Objects

- To create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world.
- To promote the principles of good government and good citizenship.
- To take an active interest in the civic, cultural, social and moral welfare of the community.
- To unite the clubs in the bonds of friendship, good fellowship and mutual understanding.
- To provide a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest, provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.
- To encourage service-minded men to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavors.

Lions Code of Ethics

- To show my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.
- To seek success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.
- To remember that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.
- Whenever a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or action towards my fellow men, to resolve such doubt against myself.
- To hold friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.
- Always to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state and my community, and to give to them my unswerving loyalty in word, act and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means.
- To aid my fellow men by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.
- To be careful with my criticisms and liberal with my praise; to build up and not destroy.
