Georgetown Lionesses

The Georgetown Lioness Club was organized and sponsored by the Lions Club in the fall of 1970.

Since its inception, it can be truly said that "Good Lady Lions make successful Lions Clubs", or that men will stay in the Lions Club because their wives so enjoy Lioness activities.

The relationship of the Lioness Club to the Lions Club may be defined as one of creative support. Since most members are the wives of Lions, the ties between the two clubs are quite strong. The Lioness Club does, however, carry out service activities they plan and implement themselves. The nature of Lioness programs seeks to embrace both aspects of assistance and independence.

During the past ten years the Lioness Club has been very active in Georgetown working on many varied fund-raising projects and service activities. Some of the more popular fund-raising projects have been the annual bowl-a-thon, ladies only stag night, garage and bake sales, euchre nights and numerous dances.

In 1977, the Lioness Club adopted a young Mexican girl through Foster Parents. The Club also makes many visits to

senior citizen homes and the hospital visiting the sick and shut-ins. Each year Lionesses can be seen playing a very active role in the annual Santa Claus Parade with a float entry and giving out candy to the children.

The Club has made countless donations amounting to

thousands of dollars. Donations of \$2,000 were made to the hospital, \$1,700 to Halton Women's Place, \$1,500 to the Georgetown Memorial Arena.

Annual donations go to minor hockey and baseball, Meals on Wheels, Contact Centre, Retarded Children Association, Camp Dorset, Children's

Aid, Care and Lions International Foundation. The Lioness Club have also undertaken to furnish the Lions Hall with dishes and utensils, costing hundreds of dollars yearly.

Lionesses have come a long way in providing community services and as long as the human need continues to exist, Lionesses will be there to assist.
